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# Voice of GOD



## Sri Swarnapureeswarar Temple, Sembanarkoil

This is the 159th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 42nd sthalam on the south side of river Kaveri in Chozha Nadu. This place was called Thiruchemponpallai during the 6th to 7th Century and is now called Thiruchampalli / Sembanarkoil. In Periyapuramam Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshipping Lord Shiva of Mayiladuthurai. But Thirunavukkarasu Swamigal came from Thiruvengadu. Sekkizhar mentions only 7 temples but the Periyapuramam indicates 17 temples, from Thiruvallampuram to Kodika / Thirukozhambam, and this place is mentioned as other temples.

Moolavar : Sri Swarnapuriswarar, Sri Devapriyar, Sri Sornalakshmeesar, Sri Chemponpalliyar.

Consort : Sri Maruvur Kuzhali, Sri Pushpazhaki, Sri Thaakshiyayini, Sri Suguntha Kunthalambigai, Sri Suguntha Vananayagi.

Some of the important features of this temple are as follows.

This is one of the Mada temples constructed by Ko Chenkat Chozhan. The temple is facing east with an entrance arch. There is no Dwajasthambam and Rajagopuram. Balipeedam and Rishabam are in front. Moolavar is on a round avudayar with 16 lotus petals on top and bottom. In Koshtam, Indra Ganapathy, Dakshinamurthy, Arthanareeswarar and Durgai. Dwarapalakas are in the artha mandapam. In Sthapana mandap Urchavars Somaskandar, Natarajar, Chandrasekar and Pichadanar. In Maha mandapam Vinayagar, Surya and Chandra Lingas and Subramaniam. A bas-relief of a monk and a King worshipping Lord Shiva is on the south wall. In Prakaram Prakasa Pillayar, Vanadurgai, Viswanathar, Srinivasa Perumal, Sibi Kaatchinathar with maan and mazhu, Balasubramaniam with Rudraksha mala and holding Sakthi ayutham/ weapon, Gajalakshmi, Jyeshta Devi, Veerabhadra, Suriyan and Bhairavar.

Ambal is in a separate temple facing south. It was told that Ambal is facing south since, Ambal is proceeding to the Pariyalur Shiva temple, which is on the southwest of this temple where Dakshan was performing a Yagna. Sathakannir temple is on the southwest of Ambal temple.

Chidambaram Swamigal has also sung in praise of Lord Muruga of this temple in his Kshetra Kovai Pillai Thamizh.

The sanctum sanctorum consists of sanctum antarala and artha mandapam. An eka thala vesara Vimana is on the sanctum Sanctorum. Bas relief of King worshipping Lord Shiva and on his both sides are a monk and a minister.

### HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

It is believed that this temple was built during Ko Chengat Chozha. Based on the iconography of the Jyeshta Devi, it is presumed that this temple might have been reconstructed during Aditha Chozha (879 – 907 CE), which is mentioned in the Sthala Purana. There are Six inscriptions recorded from this temple. They belong to Kulothunga Chozha-III, Rajathirajan and Thanjavur Saraboji Maharaja.

Rajathirajan's 5th reign year inscription records the gift of land to Shiva Temple of Thiruvallangadu, by the Thiruvilanagar alias Nithavonotha Chathurvedi Mangalam Vila Ndu Sabhai / assembly.

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## Dug up road opened again



Motorists and pedestrians suffered at the hands of government agencies by digging up the road regularly. This Erikarai Link Road which connects Anna Main Road in K.K Nagar and Ramapuram was opened again for the public use by the Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (CMWSSB) for laying sewage pipelines. This road has been dug up for the second time in the last four months. In November, the road was left unattended for more than a month after digging up and was relaid after pressure from local people. The Link Road is 'S'- shaped with narrow bends and, therefore, the damaged road poses threat to the life of motorists and pedestrians. The portion of the road, a tri-junction of Anna Main Road, Munusamy Road and Nesapakkam Road, was demolished. Apart from this, a popular Tasmac outlet is located close to the tri-junction, where the customers have made the situation worse, especially in the evening. The link road was opened in 2017 to ease the traffic in the area as Nesapakkam is a transit point to reach various places including Porur, Valasaravakkam and Ramapuram.

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# No right turn but for all on at 100ft road Vadapalani

Motorists taking a no right turn on are at risk for they run into traffic coming from the opposite direction of Vadapalani signal and also from a lane that joins Vengeeshwarar Temple which is also to take a wrong route towards Arcot Road. Besides the risk of an accident, the manoeuvre leads to congestion.

The traffic police has directed motorists to take a u turn under the bridge under Vadapalani flyover but many motorists are not obeying the law even though there is a sign board of no right turn. People still violate the rules.

Many times a motorist are trying to take a right turn on the road, it comes close to colliding with a vehicle which is coming either from the other side and those coming from the lane adjoining 100 ft road. At least traffic policemen should be posted to regulate the traffic at the no right turn spot.

### Girl, mother booked under Pocso

A strange case has been booked under Posco Act in Kodambakkam Police Station 19-year-old girl and her mother were booked after a complaint was filed by the mother of a 17-year-old boy alleging stalking her minor boy.

The complaint, filed at the Kodambakkam Police Station, claims the two were involved in a relationship while the boy was pursuing class 12. Both are now studying in different colleges. The complainant alleged that the girl, who is older than her son, engaged in inappropriate behaviour with him, leading to the filing of the complaint under the Pocso Act, which protects minors from sexual exploitation. Along with the girl, her mother has also been named in the complaint.

### 2 booked for encroachment

The Virugambakkam police on Wednesday registered a case against two DMK functionaries who allegedly tried to encroach a piece of land near Vadapalani. The accused had brought down the compound walls using an earthmover and raised a shed on the land, the police said. The two men were identified as Suryasivakumar and Srinivasan. According to Paudurai (71), he had taken the land on lease from the owner, who lives abroad, 20 years ago, police said. However, the two DMK functionaries claimed that the power of attorney rested with them. A probe is on to check the veracity of

both these claims, police said.

### Man arrested for harassment

A 30-year-old man was arrested for assaulting and sexually harassing a 36-year-old woman whose husband is a mentally challenged man. The woman was living with her husband and children at Koyambedu. Her neighbor Ganapathy alias Saravanan was frequently trying to sexually harass her and speaking obscene words to her. On Monday, Ganapathy assaulted her when she was returning from a shop, threatened her with a knife and tried to sexually harass her. She lodged a complaint with the Maduravoyal police station and a case was registered. The man was arrested after investigations.

### Neighbour's pet dog bites 5-yr-old girl

A five-year-old girl sustained injuries after her neighbour's pet dog bit her near her house at Saidapet on Monday afternoon. The police have registered a case against the dog's owner. According to the Saidapet police, Praveena was outside her house when the dog bit her. She sustained minor injuries on her hands and legs, the police said. Her parents rushed her to a government hospital, where she was treated and sent home the same day, the police said.

Based on a complaint, the police have registered a case against the dog's owner Mala. Corporation officials said that they were inquiring into the issue and action will be taken accordingly at the zonal level.

### Cab driver found dead inside car

Police on Sunday night recovered the body of a 40-year-old man from a parked car in Saidapet. Police suspect that he died of asphyxiation.

Residents in Manthope Colony alerted the local police after the car remained parked at the same spot near a Tasmac outlet in Manthope since Saturday evening, and

the inside the car seemed unconscious.

On reaching the scene, the police broke open the door and moved the man to a hospital, where he was declared dead on arrival. Police then moved the body to a government hospital for a post-mortem examination.

The police identified the deceased as Tamizhmaaran, a native of Sivaganga district. The probe revealed that he was working as a call taxi driver in the city for the last few months.

The police suspect him of having slept inside the car with the air conditioner on for long hours, which would have led to carbon monoxide poisoning. Saidapet police have registered a case, and investigations are under way.

### Teen biker rams man, mom held

A 76-year-old man was injured after a 16-year-old boy riding a bike crashed into him in Saligramam on Friday. According to police, Sampath was on his way home from a grocery shop when the accident happened. He sustained severe injuries and was hospitalised. Inquiries revealed that the boy had taken his mother's bike for tuition. Police detained the boy and his mother on Monday. The boy was sent to an observation home. The woman was produced before the magistrate and released on bail.



## Remove huge pipes

Pedestrians and residents of Tiruvalluvar Salai, Alwarthirunagar are unhappy over several huge pipes dumped on the pavement, occupying the width entirely and creating a hindrance on the footpath near shopping malls.

Residents claim that it's been a while since it was dumped. These massive pipes on the footpath, evidently ignorant of the hardship it would create.

The concerned department, having given permission to lay the pipelines, never follows up to see whether the job is done properly, laments Karthikeyan, a long time resident. Now, these pipes have simply been left on the footpath and pedestrians have no option but to walk on the street, he complained.

Over 300 metres of the footpath have been acquired by the pipelines and no space has been left for the hapless pedestrians to use, complains Jawahar, a long time resident. They are dumped in a haphazard manner, he added. The road is a busy one, used by a huge number of commuters, thus making it risky for pedestrians, he lamented.

Traffic movement here is already slow due to the number of vehicles plying. Motorists driving on the wrong side of the road add to the problem and peak hours are a nightmare, Kavitha said. Pedestrians have only just missed major accidents. The concerned department should take immediate action so that pedestrians can use the pavement to walk, she concluded.

## Motorists suffer in Valasaravakkam



Kaikankuppam V.A.C. Street is located in Ward 152 of Valasaravakkam Zone. It is a road connecting Valasaravakkam and Ramapuram areas. This road, which was under the maintenance of the State Highways Department, has now been handed

over to the Corporation.

The Highways Department constructed a stormwater drain on this road at a cost of Rs. 20 crore and paved the road at a cost of Rs. 1.5 crore.

The road is constantly being dug up by service departments, causing potholes to form on the road, making it rough and uneven.

Currently, the road has been submerged and a small pothole has formed. The pothole has not been repaired even after several days. Therefore, there has been a demand from the local people that the pothole should be repaired.

## Broken water pipe residents irked

Naidu Road is connected to Ramapuram and Valasaravakkam. A water supply pipe runs through this road to the interior streets in the area was broken recently. This ward was recently provided with sewerage and drinking water connections. This pipe suddenly broke. Due to this, water has been leaking onto Naidu Road since last three days.

Thousands of liters of drinking water were wasted in this. The locals have demanded that the Water Board identify the broken pipe and repair it immediately.



## Thangal Street caved in again

It is a road connecting Koyambedu from Virugambakkam which is a main street. Vehicles coming from Virugambakkam Arcot Road usually go through Thangal Street to Kaliyamm Kovil Street and then to Koyambedu.

A few months ago, a 20-foot-deep sewage pipe broke at the intersection of Thangal Street and Kaliyamm Temple, causing a mega pothole to form on the road. The water board officials repaired the pipe, filled the pothole with soil, and repaired the road.

In this case, during the recent rains, the road has once again caved in and a pothole has formed in the same area. Water has accumulated in this pothole, turning it into a pond. This has caused traffic congestion in the area, causing inconvenience to motorists. Therefore, motorists have insisted that the road in the area be repaired.



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
