This is the 160th Thevaram paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 43rd Sthalam on the south side of river Cauvery in Chozha Nadu. The place was called Thirunanipalli during the 6th to 7th Century and is now called Ponsei. This is the birthplace of Thirunanasambandar's mother Bhagayathy. This is

Thirugnanasambandar's mother Bhagavathy. This is one of the 44 Temples, where Moovar,

Thirugnanasambandar, Thirunavukkarasu Swamigal, and Sundarar, have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple.

In Periyapuranam, Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of Thirupungur and Thirunavukkarasu Swamigal came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of

Thirunindriyur.Thirugnanasambandar, Thirunavukkarasu Swamigal, Sundarar, and Vallalar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple. It is believed that Thirugnanasambandar has sung this hymns sitting on the shoulders of his father and the

same was mentioned in his hymns.

Moolavar: Sri Nartrunaiappar, Consort: Sri Parvatha puthiri.

Some of the features of this temple are as follows. The temple faces east with an entrance arch. Panchamurtis stucco images, Vinayagar, Murugan, Lord Shiva with Ambal as Rishabaroodar, Ambal, and Dakshinamurthy are on the entrance arch. Balipeedam and Rishabam are after the entrance arch. Moolavar is of Swayambhu. In koshtam Agasthiyar, Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy, Lingothbavar, Brahma and Durgai. In parakaram Nalvar, Vinayagar and Suriyan. Natarajar Sabha is in the maha mandapam. Ambal is in a separate sannadhi facing west. There are two Ambal Sannathis in this temple. Sri Parvatharajan puthiri is on the right side of the moolavar sannadhi and Sri Malayan Madanthai sannathi is in the prakara. There is a separate sannathi of Kalyana Sundarar and Parvati, who gave the kalyanakola darshan to the sage Agathivar.

ARCHITECTURE

The temple consists of sanctum sanctorum, antarala, and artha mandapam. An eka tala vesara vimana is over the sanctum. It is believed that the Vimana is one of the biggest Vimnas in South India. On the base of the sanctum bas-reliefs of the epic Ramayana story are worth watching.

HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple existed before the 7th Century. Later the temple was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period and extended during the Vijayanagara period. The inscriptions recorded from this temple belong to Chozha Kings, Rajaraja, Kulothunga Chozha, and Vijayanagara King Krishna Devaraya. As per the inscription, this place was in Jayankonda Chozha Valanattu Akkur Nattu Brahmadeya Nanipalli. Vijayanagara period Saka 1439 ie 1517 CE inscription records the order issued by Krishnadevaraya records his meikeerthi and tax exempted to some of the Village temples. Kulothunga period inscription records that 10 veli lands in front of Thalachangadu Vishnu temples, as archana bogam to the Thirugnanasambandar Nallur Vinayagar. Rajendra period inscriptions record the gift of lands to celebrate Rishaba Vahanam and Natarajar. The lands were gifted for Brahmins' feeding and later the donors died due to self-immolation in a fire due to a land quarrel. 200 Kasu was gifted for making 4 idols of

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Need extra bin for stopping overflow s the trash bin is overloaded passerby are dumping A garbage outside the bin in Lakshmanaswamy Road, K K Nagar. Residents appeal for an additional trash bin

to accommodate the garbage lying scattered around it. Even after many complaints the civic body is not cleaning the wastage dumped near the trash bin.

The sight of overflowing trash bins along the roadsides has been common nowadays and it is time the civic body place an additional bin in place, says Anu a local resident. Inadequate bins and delay in clearing the garbage leads to public dumping garbage on roadsides or at places of their choice. This leads to stench emanating in the area and the bins turn into a breeding place for mosquitoes.

Many bins kept along the roadsides were filled with plastic materials and dumping of waste by hawkers or shopkeepers consumes most of the space. Even chopped tree branches and cardboard boxes used for packaging were dumped in the bins leading to overflowing.

Residents point out that bins starts overflowing in a day whereas it is cleaned every two or three days. We are forced to dump on the roads due to increase in population, says Sai a local resident. The civic body for effective implementation must take steps to accommodate an additional bin to bring a permanent solution laments residents.



Al technology soon to monitor vehicle violating traffic rules

While modern cameras with AI technology have been installed at 200 locations in Chennai to capture images of vehicles violating the rules in order to issue fines, the traffic police have

decided to install 200 more cameras soon.

The traffic police are taking various measures to reduce accidents and fatalities and ensure smooth traffic flow. As part of this, fines are being imposed on drivers who violate the rules. Traffic police, who previously imposed fines while standing at road intersections, now install modern cameras at various locations and use the footage recorded to issue fines while sitting in a control room. Information regarding fines is

sent as text messages to the cell phones of the motorists concerned.

CMRL's tunnel boring machine hits a pause due to minor glitch

fter boring under two flyovers and the tracks at Kodambakkam Arailway station, Chennai Metro Rail's tunnel boring machine Pelican encountered a minor glitch. As a result, tunnelling work between Panagal Park and Kodambakkam hit a pause, at one of the tunnels. Chennai Metro Rail has been building a 26.1-km corridor from Poonamallee to Light House, via T. Nagar and Porur, to connect the eastern parts of the city to the west. As part of this work, Chennai Metro Rail has been carrying out tunnelling work at a small portion of the underground stretch, between Panagal Park and Kodambakkam.

Vacant land invites trouble

Residents of Tiruvalluvar Salai,
Valasravakkam appeal to the city
corporation find out the owner of the land to
clean and fence the vacant plot located in the
street, filled with thin vegetation, as it had
become home to rodents and anti-social
elements. They opine that their safety is at
risk

Filled with shrubs, they are today breeding grounds of mosquitoes and home to rodents, says a longtime resident on anonymity. Antisocial elements, meanwhile, use these plots to consume liquor during late evening, he added.

We urge the landowners to clean their plot and fence them with the civic body not taking much interest in it, says another resident of the locality. Vacant plots are cleaned while maintenance work is being undertaken. It must not be the case. It must be cleaned at regular intervals, he added.

The vacant plots are being misused by the residents as well as anti-social elements who openly dump debris, laments residents. Our major concern is safety as presently anti-social elements, such as drug addicts are using those vacant plots for their misdeeds.





Central metro to get a permanent book park

A large permanent book park is set to open at the Chennai Central Metro Station by the end of April, Metro Railway officials announced.

As metro trains play a crucial role in easing traffic congestion in Chennai, the Metro Railway administration continues to introduce initiatives aimed at enhancing passenger facilities and increasing footfall.

As part of these efforts, a permanent book park will be established in the subway area of Chennai Central Metro Station, catering to book lovers across the city.

According to Metro officials, the book park will feature over 50 publishers and booksellers showcasing a wide variety of titles. The facility will include 70 bookshelves, reading tables with comfortable seating, and a cafeteria to create a relaxed reading atmosphere.

Additionally, books will be sold at a 10% discount, and popular titles from well-known publishers will be available.



To attract foreign tourists, the Tamil Nadu Tourism Department has been organizing the International Kite Festival in Chennai since 2022.

The fourth annual five-day international graduation festival is set to begin on the 21st of next month on Chennai's East Coast Road.

Kite-making experts from eight countries, including France, Germany, Thailand, Singapore, Malaysia, and Switzerland, will participate with giant kites that reflect their national cultures.

With the theme of 'Let's protect marine resources', more than 250 giant kites designed in the shapes of marine life, including dolphins, blue whales, octopuses, and sharks, will be flown. Entry is free for children; adults pay 200 rupees.

The kites will be flown daily from 3:00 PM. After 7:00 PM, LED-lit, glittering kites will be flown. They will be operated depending on wind speed and weather conditions. Visitors will be allowed from 3:00 PM to 9:00 PM.

Motorists face difficulty in Arcot Road due to CMRL work

For years now, commuters have been enduring a harrowing experience whenever they pass through one of the busiest stretches in Chennai, Arcot Road. Since 2021, the Chennai Metro Rail's Phase II project construction work has been under way in the city. On Arcot Road, the Chennai Metro Rail Limited (CMRL) has been building an elevated network – from Poonamallee till Kodambakkam via Vadapalani. This elevated stretch is part of Corridor 4 (Poonamallee to Light House [26.1 km]) of the Phase II project. The remaining part of this corridor is being built underground, from Kodambakkam till Light House. However, the construction work has turned commute through the road a nightmare, road users say. From constricted road width and potholes in several sections to the absence of proper footpath, the commuters and residents have been grappling with a host of issues. In many parts of Arcot Road, especially near Saligramam, Vadapalani, and Valasarawakkam near Kesavardhini, huge potholes could be spotted, posing risk to the



GCC to take stringent action on construction waste dumpers

Despite the city corporation amplifying its drive against construction debris, the dumping of construction and demolition waste (C&D) is an issue in some pockets of the metropolis. The illegal dumping of cosntruction debris and domestic waste is an eyesore along the Choudhry Nagar, 14th street, Valasravakkam.

A conservancy worker, on condition of anonymity, said I am on duty till noon, and my job is to sweep and clear the waste. But, because of the C&D, the job becomes hellish with miscreants dumping domestic waste and used liquor bottles in the rubble'.

Ramesh a resident of Choudhry Nagar, noted that people dump solid waste late at night. Elaborating on this, a resident said. 'For over a month, strangers dump waste here. Though officials state 1,000 tonnes of waste was removed per day, many places are left with debris'.

To curb illegal dumping of C&D waste on streets, pavements, public spaces, stormwater drains (SWD) and water bodies, the Greater Chennai Corporation will impose fine of Rs. 5,000 on violators, and the rules will be strictly enforced from April 21, sources said.

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Valasaravakkam

Valasaravakkam Lake was located in the city of Valasaravakkam, SVS, in the Valasaravakkam zone. The remaining catchment area of the lake, which was destroyed due to encroachments, was recently reclaimed from encroachment. During the rainy season, rainwater accumulates in this catchment area, affecting residential areas along SVS, Nagar Main Road, and Ambedkar Road.

At that time, an electric motor will be installed on Ambedkar Road and rainwater will be discharged through a pipe into the drain on P.N. Ramamurthy Street. From there, it will go to Adyar via Bethanya Nagar, Chaudhary Nagar and Thiruvalluvar Road.

In this, the rainwater drainage channel in P.N. Ramamurthy Nagar has been damaged. Due to this, there was a problem in the outflow of rainwater.

Subsequently, work is underway to demolish the old rainwater drain for a distance of 300 meters and construct a new one at a cost of Rs. 99 lakh.

Corporation officials said that once this rainwater is used for drainage purposes, rainwater accumulating in the Valasaravakkam catchment area will be able to be quickly drained.
