## Sri Paarvatheeswarar Temple, Thiruthelicheri

This is the 167th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and 50th sthalam on the south side of river Kaveri in Chozha Nadu. This place was called Thiruthelicheri during the 6th to 7th Century and is now locally called Kaarai Kil Pathu, apart on the north side of Karaikal, near a bus stand.

In Periyapuranam Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of Thirunallar. In this Sekkizhar records that he crossed the place Bhodhimangai where Buddhists lived. In a debate, he won against Buddhists, which is described in the Legend.

Moolavar: Sri Paarvatheeswarar, Sri Sameevaneswarar Consort: Sri Parvathyammai, Sri Sakthyammai, Sri Suyamvarathabasvini. Some of the important features of this temple are.....

The temple faces west with an entrance arch and a 5-tier Rajagopuram. Dwajasthambam, balipeedam, and Rishabam are immediately after the Rajagopuram. Moolavar is under a silver mandapam and looks cute. Dwarapalakas legs are on the singamugasurar's head. In koshtam, Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy, Lingothbavar, Brahma, and Durgai.

In praharam Siva Subramaniar, Maha Lakshmi, Durgai, Suryan, Shaniswarar, Bhairavar, Vanni Lingam, Dakshinamurthy, Narthana Ganapathy, 63var, Lingothbavar, Natarajar, Ambal worshiping Lord Shiva, Nalvar, Suriyan with Renuka Devi, Navagrahas, Chandran, Kasi Viswanathar with Visalakshi and Chandikeswarar. Urchavars in Sri Veda Roopam, Pidari Amman, Giratha Murti & Ambal, Somaskandar. Pradosha Vinayagar with Ambal are special in this temple.

Moolavar is called by different names such as Mahalingam/ Brahma Lingam since worshiped by Brahma, Rajalingam, since worshiped by Amaresan, and Baskaralingam, since worshiped by Suriyan.

There is a separate Temple for Karaikkal Ammaiyar in the same city.

#### HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. Later the temple was reconstructed during the Chozha period. The temple was completely reconstructed by the Nattukottai Nagarathars.

Maha Kumbhabhishekam was conducted after renovation works on 09th May 1971 and 07th June 2004.

#### LEGENDS

It is believed that Ma Parvati, Brahma, Indra, Saint Markandeya, Arjuna, and Suriyan worshiped Lord Shiva in this temple.

As per the sthala purana, this place was existed in 4 yugas and called different names such as Brahma Vanam, in Krita yuga, Sameevanam in Treta yuga, Anandavanam in Dwapara yuga, and Mukti Vanam in this Kali yuga. Also called Mukthi sthalam, Suriya Sthalam, Guhasthalam, and Gauristhalam.

Suriyan also known as Baskaran and Suriyan worshiped Lord Shiva. hence Lord Shiva is called Baskara Lingam and the place is Baskara Sthalam. Every year Sun worships Lord Shiva in the form of Sunlight falling on Moolavar, 10 days starting from the 13th to the 22nd in the month of Panguni (March April)








## In a world of historic landmarks, the giant pink bunny stands out!

#### Man arrested for harassing woman

Kishore Kumar (32) of K K Nagar was arrested on Wednesday for harassing a 21-year old woman on a busy Vadapalani road on Tuesday.

According to the complaint, the woman was walking with her friend along the 100 Feet Road in Vadapalani when the miscreant intercepted her on the way in a two-wheeler.

She reported the incident at the Vadapalani Police Station. A case under relevant sections of the BNS and the TN Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act was registered.

Kishore was arrested on Wednesday after the investigation led by the Vadapalani police inspector, and the two-wheeler used during the alleged incident was impounded. The arrested accused was produced before a magistrate court and remanded in judicial custody.

#### Unconscious elderly woman saved

Beenabal (70) lives alone on the second floor of an apartment building in P T Rajan Salai, K K Nagar when she was absent for hours neighbours who keep checking regularly on her alerted police officers who saved the live of a 70-year-old woman living alone.

The apartment's secretary Ram alerted the K K Nagar police station and cops rushed to the scene. Head constable Narayanan and constable Maduraiveeran forced open the lock door and found Beenabal unconscious on the floor, having fallen from her bed.

The officers immediately secured medical assistance and arranged for an 108 ambulance to take her to a nearby private hospital for urgent treatment. According to police, she is reported to be recovering well. The incident highlighted the importance of community vigilance and prompt assistance for vulnerable residents living alone.

#### Youth robbed two arrested

Amit Limbu, 22, is from Assam. He works in a hotel in Ashok Nagar and lives in K K Nagar. After finishing his work on Wednesday he was walking along P T Rajan Salai. At that time, two men on a bike threatened Amit Limbu with a knife and robbed Rs 5,000 from him and escaped. According to the police it was revealed that Karthik, 23, and a 17-year-old boy from Ashok Nagar were involved in the robberyand both of them arrested. It was also revealed that the two had consumed alcohol with the stolen money. It was revealed that Karthik had 3 criminal cases against him and the boy had one criminal case against him.

## One die in SWD work after wall collapse

Ganapathy (34), a native of Ranipet a casual labourer died after a wall collapsed on him when he was engaged in stormwater drain work in Ramapuram on Wednesday. On Wednesday morning, when he was digging for a SWD work with his co-workers in a lossened soil in a burial ground Valluvar Salai, Ramapuram when the incident happened. He was declared dead on arrival. Police are investigating.

## Two men attacked women in Choolaimedu

A Dubai based man was angered by his estranged wife's decision to separate from him and initiate divorce proceedings, he sent two of his friends to her house in Choolaimedu to attack her.

According to police sources two men was arrested for assaulting the woman with iron rods and leaving her injured severely.

The victim Benazir Begum (33) separated from her husband, Zaheer Hussain, and has been living alone in Choolaimedu.

#### 395 kg of gutka seized

Three persons arrested for carrying 395 kg of Gutka and 10 kg of tobacco products in Jones Road, Saidapet when a patrol vehicle interecepted three persons on Monday night. When they were moving suspiciously on a two wheeler. After questioning them police found out tobacco products.

They were identified as Balamurugan, 30, from West Mambalam. The bag he was carrying contained 10 kg of tobacco products, including gutka.

Based on information provided by Balamurugan, they inspected a warehouse in the Saidapet area. There were also bundles of tobacco.

Police arrested Asif Beg, 33, Rajesh Kannan, 24, and Balamurugan, who were there. 395 kg of tobacco products including gutkha, hans, coolip, and vimal, 1.80 lakh rupees, a bike, and a car were seized.

#### Nigerian youth arrested in drug case

The Narcotics Intelligence Unit police, led by Ashok Nagar inspector Radhakrishnan, were conducting surveillance on Ashok Nagar Sixth Avenue on the 1st. At that time, five people were arrested, including Selvaraj, 26, from Nesappakkam, who was in possession of cocaine and methamphetamine.

46.7 grams of cocaine, 6.88 grams of methamphetamine, and five mobile phones were seized from him.

Following information provided by the detainees, the police arrested Dakshinamoorthy, 25, from Kattupakkam in Tiruvallur district, and Anthony Ogbo Okoro, 32, from Nigeria.

12.42 grams of methamphetamine were seized from them.

#### 3 sovereigns stolen

Sangeetha, 43, from Kamaraj Colony, Kodambakkam, went to a nearby shop without locking her house that night. When she returned, the house ransacked and the bureau was opened and three sovereigns of jewellery were stolen. The Kodambakkam police are investigating the matter.

### Two injured in cooker explosion

A shop called 'Dogha Snacks' is operating on South Usman Road, T.Nagar. Mubarak, 34, and Afzal, 35, work at this shop along with their friends.

Around 10:00 PM, on the occasion of Bakrid, the two of them were cooking meat in a cooker for the hotel staff.

Then, when Mubarak tried to open the cooker, it suddenly exploded, injuring Mubarak and Afzal. Immediately, friends rescued them and admitted them to the Kilpauk Government Hospital.

Mubarak is undergoing treatment as an inpatient due to swelling in his eyes and forehead. Afzal has returned home after receiving treatment. The Mambalam police are investigating the incident.



# Maintain vacant plots or get ready to cough up 25,000 in fine

Property owners who fail to comply with the new corporation guidelines for maintaining vacant lands will face penalties of up to 25,000, with an additional fine of `500 per day for repeated violations. A resolution was passed to this effect in the council on Wednesday. The move is aimed at preventing public health concerns arising from poorly maintained vacant lands that allow for breeding of mosquitoes and other pests, and garbage accumulation.

Landowners are now required to regularly monitor their properties to ensure that garbage, construction debris,

overgrown vegetation, and stagnant water are cleared promptly. Proper fencing, drainage systems, and vector control measures must be in place. Waste must be disposed of in line with SWM 2016 norms. The owners must share their address and contact to the revenue officials in zones so that they can be contacted in case of complaints of poor maintenance, the resolution stated. During inspection, the land owners must cooperate, it

In cases of non-compliance, the corporation will issue a formal notice. If the issue is not resolved within seven days, the GCC will clean the site using its own resources or contractors. The cost of cleanup, 5800 (up to five tonnes of waste) and `11,600 (up to 10 tonnes) will be recovered from the property owner. The new measures are based on the Solid Waste Management Act, 2016, Tamil Nadu Urban Local Bodies (TNULB) Act, 1998, and TNULB Rules, 2023 (sections 384, 385, and 392). As per the current rules, the city corporation collects a vacant land tax for vacant plots.

## Vaikasi Visakha Brahmotvam in Vadapalani Murugan Temple

The wedding ceremony was held with great pomp and ceremony at the Vadapalani Murugan Temple Monday, the main day of the Vaikasi Visakha Brahmotvam. A large number of devotees had darshan of the Lord Murugan.

It was began with flag hoisting on May 31. 9th Monday morning, the Shanmugar Vidhi Ula was held with the Valli Devasena. This was followed by the Theerthavari Utsavam.

Monday evening, the main event of the Brahmotsavam, the Thirukalyana Utsavam, began. The ceremony of placing the Seerana plate and the Yajamana Sankalpa ceremony took place. Next, the Kalasa Puja was performed, and the ceremony of offering flowers to the Lord and tying the kapu took place.

The yagasala was built and the homams were performed. This was followed by the changing of the garlands, the offering of milk and fruits. Then the Thirumangalya Puja was performed.

This was followed by the Thirumangalya Dharanam, the engraving ceremony and the Deeparathanai. Then, the Mantrapushpam, Chaturveda, and the joint prayer, the Maha Deeparathanai took place. In this, a large number of devotees participated and received the blessings of Lord Muruga.

After the wedding ceremony of Lord Muruga, the Moi writing ceremony was held. At night, a wedding feast was served to 750 devotees.

Those who wrote Moi were given a yellow bag containing Swami's prasadam of turmeric, kunjkumam, thirumangalyasaradu, bangles and sweets by the temple administration.

The departure took place in the peacock chariot at night. Then, the Brahmotsavam concluded with the lowering of the flag. Tonight, Subramaniar will depart in a special flower palanquin.

The festival will be held from the 11 to 20th. It will feature Bharatanatyam, a lecture, and a musical concert.

# Drainage works at 175 locations to be started at a cost of Rs. 70 crore

A reas like Valasaravakkam, Porur, and Ramapuram are affected by flooding every monsoon. The reason for this is the lack of rainwater drainage facilities.

To prevent this, it was decided to construct a stormwater drainage canal from Ward 143 to Ward 155, which falls within the Valasaravakkam zone, an expansion area of the Chennai Corporation.

Accordingly, contracts have been sought to construct stormwater drainage systems at 175 locations for a cost of Rs 70 crore, and work has begun.

In particular, a rainwater drainage channel is being constructed at a cost of eight crore rupees to connect the Nandambakkam canal to the Ramapuram Thiruvalluvar road, which is particularly prone to waterlogging and causing severe damage.

# Major Reform in railways

Indian Railways has begun a pilot project to release final passenger charts 24 hours before train departure, a shift from the current practice of releasing them just 4 hours in advance. The move aims to reduce last-minute travel stress and improve planning, especially for waitlisted passengers.

Key Highlights:

Pilot Project: Rolled out under the Bikaner Division of the Western Railway from June 6.

Review Underway: Feasibility reports to be assessed before wider implementation across other divisions. Passenger Benefits:

- Early charting allows better travel planning.
- Helps passengers from non-stoppage stations coordinate travel to major boarding points.
   Tatkal Booking Rules Updated:
- Aadhaar verification is now mandatory.
- IRCTC users with Aadhaar-linked accounts get priority during the first 10 minutes of Tatkal booking.
- Agents barred from access during the initial window to curb touts.

Current System Recap:

- Charts are now made 4 hours before departure (or night before for early trains).
- Final chart updates waiting list statuses and reallocates quota seats.
- Fully confirmed e-tickets cannot be cancelled after charting; fully waitlisted e-tickets are auto-cancelled.
   An official Railway Board decision is expected after the pilot concludes, press release said.

# GCC to roll out tender for street light worth Rs. 94.10 cr

The Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) has approved a 94.10 crore project to undertake the

maintenance of 3.01 lakh street lights and 507 high mast lights across the city for one year. As part of the initiative, the civic body will also procure 40,688 new LED lights at a cost of 39.66 crore to replace damaged ones. The maintenance component alone is estimated to cost 54.44 crore. Unlike previous years, where the inhouse electrical department managed the upkeep, the work will now be outsourced to private contractors.



# GCC to set up EV charging stations at 15 key locations

With the rise in electric vehicle (EV) usage, the Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) has announced plans to install EV charging stations at 15 locations across the city to strengthen public charging infrastructure.

In coordination with the Tamil Nadu Green Energy Corporation Limited, GCC has identified beaches, parks, playgrounds, and other government-owned lands in all 15 zones for the initiative.

Some prominent locations include: Somasudharam Ground, Corporation Playground (Kodambakkam), Egmore National Art Gallery, Magaral Park (Ambattur), Chetpet Eco Park, Bougainvilla Park (Anna Nagar), Semmozhi Park, Nageswara Rao Park, Marina Beach Parking (Teynampet), Besant Nagar, Thiruvanmiyur Beach Parking (Adyar).

# Bus hub with commercial complex in Vadapalani soon

In a major step toward urban infrastructure development, Chennai is set to get a state-of-the-art Integrated Bus Hub with a Commercial Complex in Vadapalani. The project, undertaken by the Chennai Metro City Development Company, is estimated to cost \$1800\$ crore and will be developed over 6.65 acres of prime land.

The project will feature a modern bus terminal on the ground floor, designed to handle up to 1,475 passengers and provide parking facilities for wheeled vehicles for up to 214 days.

Above the terminal, the development will include 10 floors of corporate office space, catering to Chennai's growing demand for commercial real estate. Floors 11 and 12 have been earmarked for specialized sectors such as animation, gaming, and casting departments, promoting creative and tech-based industries.

The 5th floor of the complex will host restaurants, shopping malls, and solar cell infrastructure, blending transit convenience with leisure and sustainability. The project is expected to be a model for integrated urban mobility and commercial development, making Vadapalani a new landmark hub in Chennai.



# Metro work in full swing

Metro rail flyover works are in full swing on the Sholinganallur Metro Rail line, from Koyambedu to Alwarthirunagar.
