Ambulance vehicles stranded in sudden traffic jam on Govindan Road

Praffic congestion is caused regularly and on L Thursday vehicles were stranded due to ongoing water supply board and municipal corporation work on Govindan Road in West Mambalam.

Govindan Road is located in West Mambalam, Ward 140, Kodambakkam Zone. It connects areas including Ashok Nagar, K.K. Nagar and T. Nagar. Rainwater drainage work is underway on this road by the Corporation.

Similarly, on behalf of the Drinking Water Board, trenching and pipe laying work is being carried out to provide a connection from the sewage pumping station on Thambaiya Road, West Mambalam to the Saidapet sewage pumping station.

These two works caused heavy traffic jams Thursday morning, with vehicles lining up from Govindan Road to Ashok Nagar, 11th Avenue.

In this, two ambulances that had rushed to the spot with

Sri Dharbaranyeswarar Temple, Thirunallar

This is the 169th Thevara Padal Petra Shiva Sthalam on the south side of the river Kaveri and the 52nd Sthalam in Chozha Nadu. This is one of the Moovar Paadal Petra Shiva Temple. This temple is one of the Saptha vidanga sthalangal. (The 6 other temples are Thiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Thirumaraikadu, Thirukkaarayil, Thiruvaimur, and Thirukolili-Thirukkuvalai). This is one of the 44 temples on which Moovar has sung in praise of Lord Shiva. This place was called Dharparanyam, Nagavidangapuram, and Nalesuram during ancient times.

In Periyapuranam Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of Dharmapuram.

Thirugnanasambandar, Thirunavukkarasu Swamigal, Sundarar, and Vallalar have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple. Thirugnanasambandar has sung the hymn 'Bogamarntha Poonmulayal' in the analvatham and the same was called "Pachai Thirupathigam".

Moolavar : Sri Dharbaranyeswarar, Sri Thirunallatreswarar. Consort : Sri Piranambigai, Sri Praneswari and Sri Bogamaartha Poonmulaiyal. Some of the salient features of this temple are... The temple faces east with 5-tier Rajagopuram and the front mutram was converted as mandapam. Moolavar is of Swayambhu since Lord Shiva came through Dharbai (A type of grass) and there is a scar on his head. In koshtam Dakshinamurthy, Vinayagar, Brahma and Durgai.

On the side, Unmatha nadana Thyagesar is with Devi Nilothlambal. Thiagarajar is called as Naga Vidanga Thyagar- Sri Shenbaga Thiagarajar and the dance is called as Unmatha nadanam.

In the outer praharam Nalan's history as painting, Vasantha mandapam (a new mandapam is constructed and on the pillars Stucco images of Shiva's dance). On the right and left of Sri Shani Bhagavan sannidhi -Kumbha and makara rasi reliefs are covered with brass plates.

In the inner prakaram, Sundarar, 63var, Naleswarar. Sthala Vinayagar Swarna Ganapathy, Saptha vidanga sthala Shiva Lingas, Subramaniar, Adhiseshan, Nalanarayana Perumal, Mahalakshmi, Bhairavar. Natarajar sabha and Urchavars. On the right side, is the temple for Idayan, his wife, and Accountant /kanakkan. In the mandapam pillars 10 types of Shiva's dance stucco images.

Maragatha Lingam is in safe custody and Pooja will be conducted during the morning at 08.30 Hrs abhishekam.

The 15th Century Saint Arunagirinathar sang hymns in praise of the Muruga of this temple. HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar and Appar have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. Later the same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozhas period and extended during Vijayanagaras / Marathas.

As per the inscription this temple was under Uyyakondar Valanattu Muzhayur Nattu Thirunallar and Lord Shiva was called Thirunallarudayar. Rajathirajan-II's 11th reign year inscription starts with meikeethi records an endowments executed by more than 10 Bhattans. Since the inscription was incomplete and could not trace this endowment was established. Probably land may be donated to this temple.

Drunk man electrocuted in Ekkattuthangal

A 35-year-old man was electrocuted after climbing onto a high-voltage transformer in Ekkattuthangal in the early hours of Tuesday. Police suspect it to be a suicide. The deceased was identified as Sathish of MGR Nagar.

Police said that the incident happened around 5.30 am on Achuthan Street. Investigations revealed that Sathish was inebriated when he climbed onto the transformer and came into contact with the high-tension wire.

Passersby alerted the authorities, after which police and fire and rescue service personnel reached the scene. After rescuing the body from the transformer, police moved the body to a hospital for post-mortem.

Further probe revealed that Sathish was under severe personal and emotional distress.

Woman attempts suicide by jumping from 4th floor, causing uproar

A woman who attempted suicide in Nana Street, T Nagar evening around 4.30 pm from a window in the fourth floor of a building.

When she was attempting by putting one leg outside of the window passers by informed firefighters and local police.



Then, firefighters broke down the door, went inside, spoke to the woman, and rescued her.

At that time, it was also revealed that she had cut her hands. She was immediately rushed to hospital for treatment and handed over to her parents.

During the investigation, it was revealed that she was suffering depression.

School girl injured after being hit by mini lorry

The incident in which a school girl was injured after being hit by a mini lorry in Nesapakkam caused a stir. Swathi, 20, is a resident of Bose Street, Nesapakkam. She went on her twowheeler to drop her sister's son Santosh, 12, and daughter Janani, 10, to a private school in Sector 9, K.K. Nagar.

While returning to Anna Main Road on the Nesapakkam Lakeview Road, the three fell down when a mini lorry coming from behind hit the scooty In this, Janani suffered a minor injury to her right leg. Following this, they returned home after receiving treatment at a private hospital in K K Nagar. The mini-lorry driver who caused the accident apologized to the victim, but her parents said they did not want to file a complaint.

Minor boy attacked by stray dog in Ramapuram

A stray dog attacked a 9 year old boy outside his

apartment in Ramapuram on Sunday night. The injured child lives with his mother in an apartment on Thiruvalluvar Salai.

Police sources said that the injured child is a slow learner and is a class 2 student at a private school in Shenoy Nagar.

On Sunday night, when the child was playing outside the apartment, a stray dog pounced and bit his leg. Hearing the boy's cries, his mother rushed to his aid and moved him to a private hospital in Nandambakkam where the boy was treated.

The mother has filed a complaint with the Ramapuram police.

he initiative was launched with an emotional story telling session led by the cancer winners where each one of L them took the centre stage to share their personal stories of courage, strength and triumph. These raw and inspiring narratives served as a beacon of hope for others walking down a similar path.

Master Lithin, a 10-year-old Medulloblastoma survivor from Chennai, said, 'I was too little to understand cancer, but I knew I wanted to get back to playing. The doctors helped me fight, and my family never let me lose hope. I went through many treatments, but today, I feel strong. I may be small agewise, but my fight was big, and I won over it. Now, I just want to live, laugh, and grow.

Mrs Monica, a psychologist and Hodgkin Lymphoma survivor from Chennai shared her extraordinary journey of survival and purpose'. 'Just months after giving birth, I discovered a lump-first mistaken for tuberculosis but later confirmed as Hodgkin lymphoma. What followed were relentless relapses, five lines of chemotherapy, a bone marrow transplant and 35 rounds of radiation, etched across my body in the shape of a cross. I endured physical pain and the heartbreak of missing my child's early years. But with faith, family and fierce hope, I rose like a phoenix. Today, I run a thriving business and serve as talen and OD specialist at Maatram 360, working to challenge stigma and inspire change', she said.

Master Shrikar, who survived optic nerve sheath meningioma, said losing vision in one eye changed how I see the world - but not how I see myself. I faced every scan, every treatment, and every challenge with belief that things would get better. Proton therapy gave me hope, and my family's strength kept me going. I've learned that even when life blurs, courage brings clarity

Rlys likely to hike fares

The Railway Ministry is planning to increase train fares slightly from July 1, 2025, officials said on Tuesday

For Mail and Express trains, the fare for non-AC classes may go up by 1 paisa per kilometre. For all AC classes, the fare may rise by 2 paise per kilometre. Officials said this would be the smallest fare hike compared to earlier increases in 2020 and 2013.

Good news for regular commuters: there will be no increase in fares for suburban trains and monthly season tickets.

Also, ordinary second class fares will stay the same for distances up to 500 km. For longer distances, there could be a small increase of half a paisa per kilometre.

The last fare hike was on January 1, 2020, when second class fares for ordinary trains went up by 1 paisa per km, Mail/Express by 2 paise, sleeper class by 2 paise, and AC classes by 4 paise.

Broken manhole to break the man..

Anholes are meant to look at the underground lines and pipes for the underlying damages and blockages. But the manhole available in Raghavan colony Main Road, Vadapalani is in broken condition and the cover meant for the manhole is half gone inside the hole.

To avoid vehicles to get into the manhole pit, some wooden piece is placed over it. However rain water can easily move the wooden piece and if the water gets stagnated, two wheelers will

get struck and fall off in no time. Also, this will not prevent the rain water getting inside the pit carrying and dumping all the wastage into it. This further worsen the drainage block.

Hence it is mandatory to replace the broken manhole lid with a proper lid, immediately.



The new flyover at CIT Nagar in Chennai

The Tamil Nadu government is taking huge efforts to ease the traffic congestion in Chennai. In this regard, flyovers are being constructed in Chennai are well known to us.

At a cost of Rs 164.92 cr, construction of flyover is going on in the busy south Usman Road and CIT Nagar Main Road in the Kodambakkam zone. It is now said that this flyover at CIT Nagar would accommodate about 40,000 vehicles every day.

It was revealed by the press release from GCC that to reduce traffic congestion in GCC 13 new bridges at a cost of Rs 246 cr have been constructed in the last 4 years. It added that 17 new bridges are being constricted at a cost of Rs 676.29 cr.

The bridge or flyover that is being constructed at CIT Nagar would ease the traffic congestion in areas like south Usman Road, Park Street, Madeley Road Junction, Southwest Bock Street, New Bock Road junctions and CIT Nagar north road junction. The superb piece of information is that this upcoming flyover could accommodate 4000 vehicles per day.

Super speciality GH for kids to come up in Guindy

The state government has identified 6.5 acres of land at the King Institute of Preventive Medicine and Research in Guindy for setting up a super speciality hospital exclusively meant for children. The construction will begin in September and the work will be completed in two years, health minister Ma Subramanian said. Subramanian along with health secretary P Senthilkumar and Dr MGR Medical University with the Secretary P Senthilkumar and Dr MGR Medical

University vice-chancellor Dr K Narayanasamy inspected the site on Sunday. Speaking to reporters, Subramanian said the project will cost Rs 487.7 crore. The hospital will have a six-storey building and will include quarters for nurses,

doctors, and professors, among other facilities. It will have 20 specialities and 750 beds, including 100 for ICU, he added.

Apart from paediatric super speciality departments including medicine, critical care, surgery, and gastroenterology, it will also have higher paediatric super speciality departments including oncology, urology, neurosurgery, and transplant unit, the minister said. It will be constructed with biochemistry, microbiology, pathology and imaging suite diagnostic labs apart from dialysis unit, endoscopy suite, interventional radiology and other facilities. An announcement regarding an exclusive super speciality hospital for children had been made in the Assembly earlier.
