






Sewage overflow

Sewage overflow is not a new issue for the residents of Chennai. This has become a recurring problem in Ashok Nagar, 10th Avenue. The similar situation continued on Sunday from outside of ESI Hospital.

The residents have been complaining about the overflowing sewage on the street when ever it happens. Most of the people living in the area use the street and have been facing the hardship of crossing the filth on almost last Sunday.

This issue has been prevailing for several months. Despite raising complaints several times, no action has been taken by the officials concerned for a permanent solution. The toll-free number only takes in complaints, but there is no follow-up after that. No major steps are taken to resolve civic concerns', said Kumar, a resident in the area.

The overflowing sewage also poses a health hazard to the people. The residents claim that the area has become very prone to the mosquito menace.

'As the road is situated near a school, shopping complex and residential areas a large number of students and parents walk through this flowing dirt. The stench from this

wastewater causes difficulty for the pedestrians and the residents, and the sellers nearby. If not attended to, the situation could turn worse during the rains. Sewage mixing with stagnated rainwater will worsen the situation.

Woman arrested for selling liquor

Vasanthi, 53, a woman residing in Fifth Street, Kamarajar Colony was arrested on Thursday while standing suspiciously after questioning her police found out that she was selling illegal liquor at home. Police seized nearly 30 liquor bottles from her residence. She already has 11 pending cases against her at the Kodambakkam police station for selling liquor bottles.

Gym trainer arrested for threatening woman

A 36-year-old woman living with her mother and child in the Kodambakkam police station limits was dating Vijay, 25, whom she met through a face book. The woman left him due to his inappropriate behaviour.

But Vijay has been threatening the woman, saying that he will publish the photos and pornographic videos in the internet. On April 6, Vijay went to the woman's house and threatened to kill her.

The Kodambakkam police, investigating the woman's complaint, arrested Vijay on Thursday. His phone was also seized for further investigation.

Man arrested for defrauding

Kannan, 53, is a resident of 48th Avenue, Ashok Nagar. As he owns a land near Achirupakam, Chengalpattu district.

In 2017, Kannan met another person named Rajesh Kannan from Kanchipuram district as he given idea to start a dairy farm in his land and Rajesh Kannan extracted money Rs.16 lakh to obtain license and permission in the government agencies as he did not fulfill his promises and not returned the money back. Kannan approached Ashok Nagar Police Station and filed a cheating complaint against Rajesh Kannan. Police arrested Rajesh Kannan and filed a case.

Woman falls from terrace while on phone

A woman from Choolaimedu was speaking on her

mobile phone while standing on the fourth floor terrace of a building. She slipped and fell to her death on Sunday night. Police said Sharmila, 45, was a housekeeping staffer at a hotel.

Sharmila went to the terrace of her apartment building around midnight after her son called her.

While speaking to him over the phone, it was said that she was standing near the edge of the terrace, where the retaining wall was only about two feet high. During the call, she lost her balance and plummeted to the ground. Local residents, who heard her cries, rushed out and found her severely injured. She was immediately taken to a nearby private hospital, where doctors declared her dead upon arrival.

Sharmila lived in the apartment with her son and daughter after the death of her husband, Raja, a few years ago.

A case was registered by the Choolaimedu police.

Youth gets thrashed for advising not to smoke

A 16-year-old boy from Washerman's Colony, Saidapet was smoking cigarette. Diwakar, 22, from the same area advised him, "not to smoke cigarettes?" and gave him advice. The boy refused and abused him, and left the place.

After some time, the boy and with other three friends came to Diwakar and argued, suddenly the gang pulled out beer bottle and hit and stabbed with knife and flood the scene.

In this incident two persons were injured and were admitted to the Royapettah Government Hospital. Saidapet police arrested a 16-year-old boy and his friends Gautham, 21, Sunday. They are searching for two absconding men.

Man arrested for placing human skull in Vadapalani

A family in Vadapalani, ran out screaming in panic after finding a skull and bones lying at their doorstep. Karunakaran, 51, is a resident of 4th Street, Somasundara Bharathiyar Nagar, Vadapalani. He works as a seller of veterinary medicines.

When I woke up in the morning and find out, there was a human skull and five bones at our doorsteps.

Shocked, Karunakaran and his family ran away screaming. The incident spread like wildfire, and the local people gathered there. A crematorium is located a short distance from the house where Karunakaran lives.

In this situation, the initial investigation by the Vadapalani police revealed that Arif Ali Khan, 35, a friend of Karunakaran's son, was involved in this act. The police have arrested him and are interrogating him.

ANPR cameras to be installed soon in major junctions

The Chennai Traffic Police have launched a major initiative to enhance traffic monitoring and enforcement by installing Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras across key locations in the city.

According to official sources, the department plans to complete the installation of these advanced surveillance cameras within the next two months. A total of 205 ANPR cameras will be set up across nine major roads, including important junctions and busy stretches such as

Ashok Pillar.



The move aims to tighten enforcement of traffic rules and reduce violations significantly. ANPR cameras are capable of capturing highresolution images of vehicle

number plates, helping authorities to identify and penalize offenders effectively.

"Cameras will be installed to such an extent that traffic violators will have no way to escape in Chennai," stated the Traffic Police Department.

This step is expected to streamline traffic regulation, improve road safety, and assist in identifying stolen or suspicious vehicles with greater efficiency.

Govt should clean Virugambakkam canal before monsoon



Mudslides have formed in Virugambakkam canal due to the lack of drainage system preventing water from flowing during the rainy season, and there is a risk of flooding.

The Canal, which begins at Nelkundram in the Valasaravakkam zone, passes through Virugambakkam, MMDA Colony, Arumbakkam, Mehta Nagar, and joins the Coovam River across Nelson Manickam Road. This canal, which has a total length of 6.3 km, is under the maintenance of the Water Resources Department.

Due to lack of proper maintenance, the canal is full of plants and vines. As a result, there is no way for water to flow smoothly in the canal, and water rises through the rainwater drain connected to it, flooding residential areas.

Chief Minister M K Stalin has directed civic officials to speed up key civic infrastructure work across 25 municipal corporations and 144 municipalities in view of the approaching northeast monsoon.

At a review meeting on Thursday, Stalin stressed the urgent need to complete stormwater drain desilting, road relaying, underground sewerage, and drinking water projects before the rains begin. He instructed departments including Tangedco, TWAD Board, state highways and local bodies to work in coordination and treat ongoing work in floodprone areas as a priority. Projects in their final stages must be completed on a war footing, he said. Officials informed the chief minister that 3,199 new project were taken up

in corporations and 4,972 in municipalities.

Stalin also asked for the timely execution of all work announced in the assembly.

Over the last four years, the govt spent more than 8,000 crore on improving more than 15,000 km of roads. Metro rail, water supply, and stormwater projects were also launched, he said.

Stalin emphasised that solid waste management, street light maintenance, and sanitation services in urban local bodies must be made more efficient. Lowlying and flood prone areas should be addressed first and desilting of drains must be completed to ensure water flows out without obstruction, he said.

Funds allocated to schools for improvement

There are 13 wards in Valasaravakkam Mandal, numbered 143 to 155. Out of these, there are a total of 21 government schools and six government aided schools, including seven higher secondary, six middle and eight primary.

Of these, 13 schools that were under the control of the District Education Department were handed over to the Corporation. Additional classrooms, perimeter walls, toilets and other development work is underway in these schools at a cost of Rs. 4.23 crore.

Milled road must be given more attention

Recycling of the road surface is one of the main reasons for milling a road surface. Apart from recycling, road milling can also enhance the quality of road surfaces and extend service life, thus improving the driving experience. Removed asphalt can be mixed with other materials and reused, thus it won't be sent to landfills. Motorists are at risk where milling — scooping out the top layer has been done but roads have not been re-laid immediately because of restrictions imposed by traffic police and shortage of milling machines as in the case of Ellai Muthuamman Kovil Street, Vadapalani is an example.

Many complain that the uneven surface on milled roads without any signage causes accidents especially at night. "We have to be careful riding along these stretches because vehicles with small wheel bases can lose control. The braking effect is also less on such roads, laments motorists. Sources say most contractors don't own milling machines and hire them. Roads have not been re-laid immediately because of restrictions imposed by traffic police and shortage of milling machines.

Frequent problems due to 40-year-old sewer pipes not being replaced

ocal residents have requested that the sewage and drinking water pipes installed in the Jafferkhanpet area 40 years ago be replaced and new ones be constructed.

In areas including Sekhar Nagar - 11 streets; Ethiraj Nagar - 7 streets; Muthurangan Block - 8 streets, which fall under Ward 139 of Jafferkhanpet, Kodambakkam Zone, drinking water and sewage pipes were buried 40 years ago.

6-inch pipes were installed according to the population at that time.

As the population has increased, the pipes cannot withstand the pressure of the excess drinking water and sewage flowing through them, causing them to break from time to time.

As a result, incidents of pipes breaking and sewage leaking onto the road, and sewage mixing with drinking water, affecting users, are increasing.

If a complaint is made, the water board digs holes in the roads and repairs pipes. However, a permanent solution to the problem has not been found.

However, due to these works, the road has become bumpy and potholed, causing difficulties for motorists. Therefore, the local people have requested that the government take steps to replace the sewage pipe in the area and construct a new one.

Construction debris piled up in bus stop, passengers irked
