

Voice of GOD



This is the 176th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and 59th sthalam on the south side of river Cauvery in Chozha Nadu. Thiruveezhimizhalai, another Paadal Petra Sthalam is very near to this temple, even the Rajagopuram can be seen if there is no obstruction. This temple is popularly known as Rahu & Kethu Temple and "South Kalahasti".

In Periyapuranam Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of Thirumeeyachur.

Moolavar: Sri Pampureswarar, Sri Seshapureeswarar, Sri Pambeesar, Consort: Sri Brambarambhigai, Sri Vandaar Poonguzhali.

Some of the salient features of this temple are......
The temple faces east with a 3-tier Rajagopuram.
Rishabam and Balipeedam are after the Rajagopuram.
In Koshtam, Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy and Durgai.
In praharam Vinayagar, Sri Valli Devasena
Subramaniar. Urchavars are Sri Subramaniar with Valli
Devasena, Natarajar, Somaskandar, Sattainathar,
Chandikeswarar, Malaieswarar in a mada type of
shrine, Adhi Pampureeswarar under the Sthala
Vruksham, Rahu, Kethu, Suriyan Adhiseshan,
Bhairavar, Saneeswaran, 5 Shiva Lingas, and Nalvars.
Ambal is in a separate sannadhi in a standing posture
facing east.

ARCHITECTURE

The main temple consists of the sanctum sanctorum, antarala, and artha mandapam. The adhistana is a simple pada bandha adhistana. A vesara vimana is over the sanctum after a level of the square base. An open mandapa was constructed around the sanctum. The space around the sanctum is in the form of a moat, and the level is below the ground level.

HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. The Original temple was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period and later extended during the Pandyas and Marathas period.

The inscriptions recorded from this temple belong to Chozha Kings Rajarajan-I, Rajendra Chozhan-I, Pandya Kings Sundara Pandyan, and Maratha king Saraboji Maharaja.

Kulothunga Chozha-III's 35th reign year inscription records the establishment of Thiruvasura Nayanar, Periya Devar, Nachiyar with a stone shrine by a Devaradiyar (Lady) called Udayal alias Narpathonnayiramanickam. For the same certain privileges were offered, by the Temple authorities/accountant and the Maheshwaras/Shiva Devotees. Latter period inscription of the same King records that in 1750 CE, Kasu received from the Thevaradiyar, and a land of 3 ma was given as irayil to the Devaradiyar.

Kulothunga Chozha-III's 31st reign year inscription records that land measuring 1.5 ma+ 3 (a fraction) onrraraiyee moonru) was given by the Temple Sabha as irayili, as per the request of Arulmozhi Brahmarayan. For the same 2100 kasu for worship and 1000 kasu for other expenses like bringing water from river Kaveri for abhishekam.

Kulothunga Chozha-III's 28th reign year inscription records the establishment of Rajaraja Vinayaka Pillayar shrine as per the order of the king by a fisherman called Kunavayiludayar Meenavan Mooventha Velalar on the banks of river Arasalaru. For the same, land was gifted to this temple as Thevadhanam by the temple sabha as per the order of the king.

Kodambakkam Zonal Councilors meet

"While the work of constructing retaining walls in the canals is underway, steps should be taken to stop the discharge of sewage into the canal and to obtain an underground sewer connection," said the councilors at the Kodambakkam Zonal Committee meeting The Kodambakkam Zonal Committee meeting was held at the Zonal Office, under the chairmanship of its chairman Krishnamurthy

In this, Virugambakkam DMK - MLA, Prabhakararaja, Zonal Assistant Commissioner Murugesan, Executive Engineers Inian, Ranganathan and other officials participated. In the meeting, 19 resolutions were passed. The councilors spoke as follows: Ward - 133, DMK, Ezhumalai: The officials worked well during the rainy season last year. All precautionary measures should be taken before the rainy season arrives this year as well. Many projects are contracted to the Ripon House. They carry out the work without properly informing the officials here. This causes many problems. Stone paving is being done along the sidewalk. Even the smooth sidewalk is being broken and stones are being laid.

Ward - 138, DMK, Kannan: A retaining wall is being constructed on the MGR Nagar canal. In this, the sewage from the residences on Pachaiyappan Street in MGR Nagar is being discharged into the canal. Due to this, the construction of the retaining wall in the canal is being affected. The Water Supply Board should serve a

'notice' to them and provide them with an underground sewer connection.

Ward - 137, DMK, Dhanasekar: Advertising stickers should not be pasted on the walls in the Chennai Corporation. If you paste a poster, it can be torn down. A homeowner who wants to paste an advertising sticker on the perimeter wall of his house must obtain permission from the Corporation. Those who do not obtain permission should be fined under the Billboard Act. Therefore, steps should be taken to remove the stickers pasted on the walls in the zone.

Ward - 129, DMK, Ravi Shankar: I have given a list of 15 roads in my ward to be repaired. They should be repaired before the rains. There are nine children's playgrounds. Only one person has been appointed to maintain them. How can one person maintain nine parks spread over several kilometers? Similarly, urgent steps should be taken to repair the storm water drains.

Regional Committee Chairman Murugesan: Park maintenance has been fixed at one employee per square foot. Since nine parks fall within that square foot, one person has been appointed. A modern machine has been provided in one zone to clear stormwater drains. In addition, Rs. 95 lakh has been allocated.

Ward - 130, DMK, Bhaskar: A water pipe under the 100-foot road flyover in Vadapalani was damaged about a year ago. Work was carried out to repair it. However,

the roads are still full of potholes and water leaks. Therefore, steps must be taken to fix them.

Ward - 128, DMK, Rathna Lokeswaran: While constructing a tar road in Virugambakkam, the road should be constructed in consultation with them as the metro rail work is underway. When the Corporation constructs a road, the Metro Rail Administration diverts traffic at the same location. As a result, the road cannot be constructed properly.

Ward - 136, DMK, Nilavarasi Durairaj: Items collected from houses, including mattresses and sofas, have been piled up in the Virugambakkam AVM area. They should be disposed of properly. Thus they spoke.

Ward - 134, BJP, Uma Anandan: In my ward, potholes are being dug on the road for special works without proper permission and notification. But the road is not being repaired properly. The Electricity Board has carried out pothole digging work on Kamakoti Road. Although the work has been completed, the road has not yet been repaired. Hostels are increasing without proper approval from the corporation. They need to be regularized.

Ward - 139, MDMK, Subramani: For the past five months, no work has come up in my ward in the context of the zonal committee meetings. When there are matters regarding work in other wards, my ward is not the only one. Is my ward being marginalized?

Vehicles that drop off devotees are also parked on the side of the road for the next ride. The vehicles of customers coming to the shops are also parked on the road, making it impossible for devotees to reach the temple entrance. During festivals and special days, the road itself comes to a standstill. From time to time, the police have issued warnings to remove all the encroaching shops on Andavar Street.

However, the encroachers are not budging.

CMRL aims to complete double-decker stretch in two months

hennai Metro Rail is all set to complete the viaduct and double-decker stretch along Arcot Road for the phase II project between Porur and Power House by the end of September.

The project is part of Corridor 4, spanning across 26.1 km from Light House to Poonamallee, as it passes through Porur and Vadapalani. The Porur-Power House section is expected to be a boon for commuters as it will connect to the Phase I network at Vadapalani and will also include a 3.75 kms double-decker stretch between Alwarthirunagar and Alapakkam.

The infrastructure will facilitate smooth and hasslefree transfers between Corridor 4 and Corridor 5 at four main locations such as Alwarthirunagar,

Valasaravakkam, Karambakkam and Alapakkam. Officials said that by mid-next year, trains will be operated on the first level of the double-decker and the second level is expected to become operational once a part of Corridor 5 is completed.

Officials from Chennai Metro Rail Limited noted that nearly 95 percent of the 340 piers required for the Porur-Power House stretch have reached completion as of now. However, the project has faced a six months delay owing to logistical challenges. They pointed out that constructing the viaduct on the confested corridor turned out to be extremely difficult as it required specialised launching girders in areas where traditional cranes could not be operated due to lack of road space.

Apart from this, workers also had to relocate large pipelines and cables before constructing the piers, ensuring that they do not disrupt traffic.

While the viaduct is almost complete, certain sections near Valasaravakkam, Alwarthirunagar and Vadapalani are still under construction and would be finished within two months. Apart from this, track-laying and overhead equipment (OHE) installation are currently underway at Vadapalani, Saligramam, Karambakkam and Alapakkam.

Officials also said that the OHE work would be completed in four months and once it becomes fully operational, the stretch would ensure better connectivity for commuters.






Postal staff arrested for financial irregularities

Manikandan a 38-year-old staff of the Postal Department was arrested for allegedly misappropriating

Rs. 25.48 lakh from the T Nagar head post office, which he allegedly invested in cryptocurrency.

Police sources said that the complaint was filed at the Pondy Bazaar police station on Monday after a recent internal audit revealed the financial irregularities.



siphoned off using forged documents related to the purchase of stationery and furniture for sub-post offices under the jurisdiction of the head post office.

Officials said Rs.25 lakh was shown as the expenditure in 24-25 for the procurement of stationery and furniture for 50 sub-post offices managed by the head post office. However, the audit revealed that the purchases were never made and documents were forged.

After registering a case based on a complaint from a senior official with the Postal Department, the Pondy Bazaar police arrested Manikandan Treasury Department staff. Police investigations revealed that he had misappropriated Rs.28 lakh but returned Rs.3 lakh and used the remaining money to invest in cryptocurrency and business enterprises. He was arrested on remanded in judicial custody.

Money extorted from IT employee

Police are investigating a transgender woman who extorted money from an IT employee.

Madhukar Pushp, 35, is from Bihar. He is an IT employee. He came to Chennai for work, has been staying at a hotel in Vadapalani.

While standing on the road in front of the hotel, two transgender people approached him and asked for money.

While he took out his purse from his pocket to give them money, the transgenders snatched it away. They stole 8,500 rupees from the wallet, claiming to offer blessings. Vadapalani police are investigating the case.

Elder brother murders younger

Chennai Police arrested arrested the elder brother of a 19-year-old teen who was murdered the previous night, a few hours after their mother had surrendered to the police confessing to the crime. Preliminary probe by Vadapalani police found something amiss, and sustained interrogation led them to uncover that the woman took the blame for her son as he was due to get married in two months.

On Friday night, Mugil (19), a casual labourer, returned home to Periyar Pathai in Choolaimedu allegedly reeking of alcohol and ganja and got into a fight with his mother Pramila (47), threatening to beat her up.

Addicted to alcohol and ganja, Mugil was also an accused in a few petty crimes and often beat up his mother, police said.

Separated from her husband, Pramila is mother of three sons with the eldest living separately while Mugil and his elder brother Vasantha Kumar (26), a construction labourer, lived with her.

Initially when Pramila surrendered before the police on Saturday morning, she told them that she had slit Mugil's throat after he threatened to kill her.

Police sent Mugil's body for post mortem to the ESIC hospital in K K Nagar, visited the scene of crime and

collected CCTV footage which showed Vasantha Kumar and his friend Kannan leaving the house early in the morning. When things didn't tally up, they began a sustained interrogation of Pramila who then revealed the truth.


Vasantha Kumar, who was fed up with his brother constantly abusing his mother, had planned to kill him. On Friday night, he allegedly executed it with his friend Kannan. Police said the wounds on Mugil's neck led them to the suspicion that Pramila might not have been the killer as doctors said they were deep and looked like it were inflicted by a man.

Vasantha Kumar and Kannan were arrested on Saturday afternoon. Pramila was also arrested for trying to shield the suspects.

Woman steals jewellery from house owner



Poor quality road in Coolaimedu due to emergency road closure



Gravel stones are scattered everywhere on Kalaimagal Street in Choolaimedu, due to the hasty construction. The locals have strongly opposed this poorly constructed road. They have demanded that this road be properly re laid again. Kalaimagal Street is located along Choolaimedu. This street is located in Sector 106 of Zone 8 of Chennai Metropolitan City.

In this situation a road was suddenly set up in Kalaimagal Street. They set up the road in a hurry between 6 am and 8 pm. However, the road began to deteriorate over the next few days. That is, the gravel, the main raw material for building the road, began to fall off. The main reason for this was that the gravel and tar were not mixed properly.

Also, the road roller was not used properly to construct this road. Since the road was constructed in a hurry, gravel stones are scattered here and there. The local people have expressed strong opposition to this. They have demanded that this road be constructed again properly.

Sewage mix in drinking water, residents irked



Residents of Balakrishna Street in West Mambalam raise complaints about sewage mixing in drinking water for the past six months, say a long time resident.

Sewage is now visibly leaking and mixing into the water supply. Despite repeated complaints, Metrowater is yet to identify the source of contamination, said residents.

After multiple complaints, Metrowater identified illegal sewage discharge from stormwater drains connected to nearby buildings. "When the sump was drained, we could see sewage in the water. We have been spending a hefty amount just to clean the sump, and yet no permanent solution was provided.

Although they checked for possible leaks, the root- cause remains unresolved.'

On Thursday, the residents of Balakrishna Street met with ward 134 councillor Uma Anandan, who assured them that the issue would be resolved immediately.
