Mangalanathar temple, Sirukudi

This is the 177th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva sthalam and 60th sthalam on the south side of river Cauvery in Chozha Nadu. The original name of Sirupidi was corrupted to the present name of Serugudi. This is a Chevvai dosham parihara sthalam. The temple is at the centre of 4 Paadal petra Shiva temples, on the east – Thirupampuram, on South

Thiruveezhimizhalai, on West – Anniyur and on North – Therazhundur.

In Periyapuranam Sekkizhar records,
Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after
worshiping Lord Shiva of Thirunallam. Sekkizhar
records that Thirugnanasambandar reached
Therazhundur after visiting the Shiva Temples on the
way, and this Sirugudi is one of the temples, but it
wasn't mentioned in particular.

Moolavar: Sri Sukshma Pureeswarar, Sri Mangalanathar, Sri Sirukudieesar, Consort: Sri Mangala Nayagi, Sri Mangalambigai. Some of the salient features of this temple are......

The temple faces east with a 3-tier Rajagopuram. The balipeedam and Rishabam are after the Rajagopuram. Moolavar is of swayambhu, and there is no abhishekam, & only sambrani thailam is applied, always covered with kuvalai. In koshtam Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy, Brahma, Durgai, Rishabanthikar, etc, In praharam Mangala Vinayagar, Sri Valli Devasena Murugan, Suriyan, Bhairavar, Navagrahas Angarakan and Chandikeswarar. Angarakan is in a separate sannadhi. Urchavar is Santhosa Aalingana Moorthy.

He was happy to see the pooja of Ambigai and kept his hand on Ambal. Ambal is in a separate temple like sannathi. Ambal is in a standing posture with abhaya varada hastham. Thirugnanasambandar's big image is in the mandapam.

ARCHITECTURE

The main temple consists of sanctum sanctorum, antarala, artha mandapam and a mukka mandapam. The adhisthana is of prati bandha adhisthana with yazhi vari above kumudam. The Bhitti starts with vedikai. The pilasters are of Vishnu kantha pilasters with square base, kalasam, kudam, mandi, palakai and Vettu pothyal. The prastaram consists of valapi, kapotam with nasi kudus, and yazhi vari. The Brick Vimanam is with one Tala, greevam, and Vesara Sigaram. HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 6th to 7th Century. Later, the same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period and further extended during the Vijayanagaras / Marathas period.

A 13th-century inscription with out start and end records the endowment of a land gifted to this temple by KoRRurudayar Nalloorirunthar alias Villavarayar established Thyagaraja Peruman shrine and land was gifted. In that, half of the land was for

Arthanareeswarar and the half for his consort Nachiyar, Azhagiya mangayar. The land periphery limits are given in detail.

Kulothunga Chozha-III's 17th reign-year inscription records that the Villages sold land measuring 3 ma to the Agastheeswaramudayar temple of the same village as Irayili. The complete inscription is not available.

Rain turns road into bed of slush



The Friday night rain brings roads more slushy in many parts of Kodambakkam and Choolaimedu. After the rain water continues to stagnate on the interior roads of Sivan Koil Street, Puliyur Second Lane Junction, Kodambakkam shown in the picture.

The ongoing underground drainage work have added to woes making pot-holed roads slushy and commute for pedestrians and motorists a nightmare. To make matters worse, the waterlogged roads are now hotbeds for mosquito breeding.

Motorists have to be careful so they don't slip and fall. A crucial road that links Kodambakkam and Choolaimedu is particularly bad. The road is dug and covered every now and then. It has been bad for a year now', says resident of Trustpuram. The poorly maintained roads and leakage of sewage from the manholes have become a common sight in the area.

The Chennai Metro Water Supply and Sewage Board (CMWSSB) officials have been digging up the roads across the city. Sewer pipeline replacement works are under way in the vicinity of Kodambakkam and Choolaimedu.

The residents noted that nearly a month ago, Metro Water officials dug up multiple places on Sivan Koil and South Sivan Street in Kodambakkam to replace the old sewer lines. Two weeks ago, the replacement of the sewage pipeline work was completed in several places in the stretch.

A resident of South Sivan Koil Street said that 'for the past few months, officials have been digging up the road, and laying and relaying manholes continuously for months.

The movement of heavy vehicles in the street has made the road unusable for commuters. Similarly, pedestrians complain they are unable to walk along the road, and the road has turned into an accident-prone place. Swift action is needed to ease the commuters' inconvenience'.

Another resident of Trustpuram 6th cross street, Aadhi said,
'Accidents are becoming
common on the Sivan Koil
Street in Kodambakkam.
The road becomes slippery
and slushy in rainy
weather.

Three officials attacked for removing encroachments

Corporation Employees, went to remove encroachments in the Patrikarai area on the Kodambakkam highway on Thursday. Officials removed the unused water pandals of all parties and flagpoles and when officials tried to remove the BJP flagpole, few people in the resisted and got into an argument with the corporation officials. At one point, they became enraged and attacked Assistant Engineer Soundaraj.

Following the attack on an assistant engineer who went to remove encroachments on the Kodambakkam highway, the police have arrested and interrogated three people based on a complaint filed by the corporation officials.

Priest robbed of gold jewellery, one arrested

Anilkumar, 61, a priest, lives alone in a house Seethalai Sathanar in MGR Nagar. David Ilavarasan, 23, a 'bike taxi' driver who is familiar with him, went to Anilkumar's house with his friends the day before Thursday.

They threatened Anilkumar with a knife and snatched away a 10 gram gold chain and 3.75 gram rings he was wearing. The police, investigated and arrested David Ilavarasan and recovered the robbed jewellery and arrested the accused.

Dog bites a man in Jafferkhanpet dies

A pitbull dog bite a chief cook in VSM Garden, Jafferkhanpet, Karunakaran, 48, a chef by profession. Six months ago, he suffered a fracture in his right thigh and underwent treatment. He used to go to work from time to time

In this situation, he had gone to work cooking with a friend on Wednesday afternoon and was sitting at the door of the house at around 3:00 pm.

At that time, a pitbull breed dog, which was chained at the house of Poongodi, 48, from the same area, broke free from the chain and came out. It suddenly bit Karunakaran on his right thigh and bit him.

The dog's owner, who came to catch it, also bit Poongadi, causing injuries to Poongadi's leg and arm. Karunakaran died on the spot. A police case was registered.

Elderly man arrested for stealing tricycle

Locals caught an elderly man who stole a tricycle parked at the entrance of a women's hostel and handed him over to the police.

Thirugnanasampandham, 50, from Nandanam, West CIT Nagar, runs a women's hostel. He has a tricycle to transport food to the hostel.

Early Wednesday morning, an elderly man was stealing a bicycle by breaking the lock. Hearing the noise, the locals caught him and handed him over to the Saidapet police.

During the investigation, it was found that the suspect was Haridas, 66, from Thiruvanmiyur. The police arrested him and seized a cutting blade and a broken lock.

Brothers arrested for attempting to attack police

Police arrested brothers who tried to attack a traffic police chief who had issued a fine to a drunk driver. Valasaravakkam Traffic Police Station Head Constable Rajesh, 35, was involved in a vehicle inspection along with Traffic Special Sub-Inspector Kannan near Porur Garden, next to Vanagaram, the Tuesday night.

Meanwhile, when the person driving the goods vehicle was checked, it was revealed that he had been drinking alcohol. Tamilselvan was fined for driving under the influence of alcohol.

Immediately, Tamilselvan informed his friends. Following this, two people who arrived at the scene had an argument with Head Constable Rajesh. When he recorded the video, they tried to attack him.

The Valasaravakkam police, who went there after receiving the information, took both of them to the police station for questioning.

During the investigation, it was revealed that they were brothers, Balaraman, 35, and Vishnu, 32, from Balamurugan Street, Alapakkam.

A case has been registered under sections including preventing a government employee from working, and the police are arresting and interrogating both of them.

Young man arrested for smuggling and supplying cannabis

A youth was arrested in Mangadu for smuggling and selling cannabis. Already 27 people, including three Africans, have already been arrested for selling drugs including cocaine, methamphetamine, and cannabis in the Arumbakkam and Choolaimedu areas. It was said that the smuggled goods where from Thailand.

Nearly 65 grams of cocaine, 20 grams of original cannabis, 6 grams of cannabis oil, three kilograms of regular cannabis and 27 mobile phones were seized from them.

Original ganja worth Rs 50,000 and his mobile phone were seized from him. The police are examining their mobile phones and conducting an investigation.

According to the police's initial investigation, Dinesh, a graduate, was eager for more money and had frequently traveled to Thailand to smuggle ganja and distribute it in Chennai. In that regard, he has gone to Thailand eight times and earned lakhs by smuggling drugs including ganja. The police have prepared a list of people who spoke to Dinesh on his mobile phone and are intensifying the investigation.

Case filed against soldier who attacked worker

Selvadurai, 38, is a resident of Annai Anjugam Nagar. He was engaged in the work of gluing tiles in a newly constructed house on Seventh Street, Velan Nagar, Valasaravakkam. Srinivasan, 42, an army soldier who lives behind this house, went to the house where he was

working the night before yesterday and said, "The noise is getting louder because of work." He argued with Selvadurai and electrician Karthik, 43, from Paraniputhur, saying, "I can't hang myself."

He also picked up the shovel lying there and attacked Selvadurai. The two then grabbed the shovel from Srinivasan's hand and attacked him.

Both parties have filed a complaint at the Valasaravakkam police station in this regard. The police have registered a case against Army personnel Srinivasan and are investigating.

Van carrying cash overturns, causing accident

A van was traveling near the Namachivayapuram bridge carrying cash of Rs.1.5 crore to refill ATM machine in Choolaimedu. The driver lost control after climbing over a large rock, hitting the road median and the van overturned. At that time, Shobana, 48, who was riding a two-wheeler behind the van, stumbled and fell. She suffered a fracture in her right leg. The van driver, Kishore, was also injured in the accident.

Anna Nagar Traffic Police rushed to the spot and recovered the cash. The van was gaurded with the protection of a paramilitary soldier armed with a gun. An investigation into the accident is ongoing.

Councilors request at Kodambakkam Zonal meeting

'Steps should be taken to stop dumping sewage into canals and to get underground sewer connections to homes. The councilors said at the Kodambakkam Zonal Committee meeting that the posters that have increased throughout the zone should be torn down and removed. The Kodambakkam Zonal Committee meeting was held at the Zonal Office, under the chairmanship of its chairman Krishnamurthy

Virugambakkam DMK MLA Prabhakararaja, Zonal Assistant Commissioner Murugesan, Executive Engineers Inian and Ranganathan and other officials participated in the meeting. 19 resolutions were passed in the meeting.

The councilors spoke as follows:

Ezhumalai, DMK, 133rd Ward: Necessary precautionary measures should be taken before the North East Monsoon. Contracts are being awarded at the Ripon Building for many works. They carry out their work without properly informing the authorities here. This causes many disruptions.

Kannan, DMK, 138th Ward: A retaining wall is being constructed on the MGR Nagar canal. In this, the sewage from the residences on Pachaiyappan Street in MGR Nagar is being discharged into the canal.

Due to this, the construction of the retaining wall in the

canal is being affected. The Water Supply Board should provide them with an underground sewer connection.

Dhanasekar, DMK, 137th Ward: Advertisement posters should not be pasted on walls in Chennai Corporation. Even if a homeowner wants to paste an advertisement poster on the perimeter wall of his house, he must obtain permission from the Corporation. A fine should be imposed for putting up advertising posters without permission. Posters pasted on walls should be torn down

R avi Shankar, DMK, 129th Ward: 15 roads in my ward that are in bad condition should be repaired before the monsoon. There are nine children's playgrounds. Only one person has been appointed to maintain them.

How can one maintain nine parks spread over several kilometers? Similarly, urgent steps should be taken to clear the stormwater drains.

Regional Committee Chairman Murugesan: One employee has been fixed for each square foot of park maintenance. Since nine parks fall within that square foot, one person has been appointed.

A modern machine has been provided to each zone to clear stormwater drains. In addition, Rs. 95 lakh has

Bhaskar, DMK, 130th Ward: A water pipe under the

100-foot road overpass in Vadapalani was damaged a year ago. Work was done to repair it. However, water is still leaking and the road is full of potholes

Ratna Lokeswaran, DMK, 128th Ward: While constructing a tar road in Virugambakkam, the road should be constructed in consultation with them as the metro rail work is underway. When the Corporation constructs a road, the Metro Rail Administration diverts traffic at the same location. This makes it impossible to construct the road properly.

Nilavarasi Durairaj, DMK, 136th Ward: Mattresses, sofas and other items collected from houses have been piled up in the Virugambakkam AVM area. They should be disposed of properly. Thus they spoke.

Uma Anandan, BJP, Ward 134: In my ward, potholes are being dug on the road for project work without proper permission and notification. After the work is completed, the road is not properly repaired.

The Electricity Board has carried out pothole digging work on Kamakoti Road. Although the work has been completed, the road has not yet been repaired. Hostels are increasing without proper permission from the corporation. They need to be regularized.

Subramani, MDMK, Ward 139: For five months, no work has come up in my ward regarding the Zonal Committee meeting. There are issues regarding the work of other wards. Is my ward being marginalized? Accounts Committee Chairman Dhanasekar: Creation of works in the ward, Assistant Executive Engineer work in

TNPCB issues guidelines for Vinayagar Chathurthi

he Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) has released a set of guidelines for the upcoming Vinayagar Chaturthi festival.

Key Guidelines for Idol Immersion Materials : Idols must be made exclusively from natural, biodegradable and eco-friendly raw materials like clay and mud. The use of Plaster of Paris (PoP), plastic and thermocol is strictly prohibited.

Decorations: Only natural materials such as dried flowers and straw should be used for idol ornaments. Tree resins can be used as a shining material. The use of single-use plastic and thermocol for decorations is not permitted.

Paints and Dyes: Toxic and non-biodegradable chemical dyes and oil paints are strictly prohibited. Only eco-friendly, water-based and natural dyes to be used.

Immersion Locations: Idols must be immersed only in the specific places notified by the District Administration for each district.

The public is also required to follow the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) guidelines.

The TNPCB has stated that these measures are crucial to prevent the pollution of seas, lakes and rivers.

Public can contact the District Collector, Superintendent of Police and the District Environmental Engineer of the TNPCB.

Smart water ATMs to be installed in 16 Corporation Schools



The Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) will soon install 16 smart water ATMs, one in each school run by the local body. It's noteworthy that Corporation Commissioner J Kumaragurubaran had made an announcement about it in the July council meeting.

Five schools in the Kodambakkam Zone and other corporation schools have been chosen in the first phase.

'We've selected the schools where there are more than 1,000 students', said a senior official in the Corporation. The Building department will choose the type of machines and the capacity of storage tanks. A similar model in the Corporation dining hall will be installed in schools'.

Earlier, in the council meeting, Commissioner Kumaragurubaran had pointed out that the existing RO systems were expensive to maintain once defunct. 'The new smart water ATMs will not only address water quality issues but also help us monitor students' water intake', he had stated.

In July, School Education Department reintroduced the 'Watet Ball' initiative across the schools. The scheme mandates a designated water break signalled by a separate bell, during which students will be told to

hydrate without leaving the classroom.

The Headmistress of Girls Higher Secondary School Kodambakkam Zone stated, 'we're following the water bell system. But one RO water plant in the school is enough for 1,400 students in our school. We heard the GCC is going to set up a water ATM in our school, which will help students', she said.

Another official attached to the Buildings department stated, 'the education department has given the school list. The works are in the preliminary stage in choosing the size of smart water ATM. Also, officials are deployed and checking the feasibility of installing it in the respective schools'.

Beneficiaries of the Scheme: Higher Secondary School MGR Nagar (K K Nagar, West Saidapet, Boys HSS on Kodambakkam Salai (Saidapet), Chennai Primary School on Jones Road (Saidapet) and Chennai Middle School at MGR Nagar (T Nagar).

Sewage overflow irks



Sewage overflow is not a new issue for the residents of Chennai. This has become a recurring problem all over the city. If that was not enough, people in the suburbs also face similar situations, and most of the roads experience the mess caused by the overflow of sewage drains. The situation in Ram colony, West Mambalamis no different. The residents have been complaining about the overflowing sewage on the street. Most of the people living in the area use the street and have been facing the hardship of cross the filth on almost all days.

'This issue has been prevailing for all most a week. Despite raising complaints several times, no action has been taken by the officials concerned. The toll-free number only takes in complaints, but there is no follow-up after that. No major steps are taken to resolve civic concerns', said Kumar, a resident in the area.

The overflowing sewage also poses a health hazard to the people. The residents claim that the area has become very prone to the mosquito menace.

The stench from this wastewater causes difficulty for the pedestrians and the residents, and the sellers nearby. If not attended to, the situation could turn worse during the sudden spell. Sewage mixing with stagnated rainwater will worsen the situation.



New traffic diversions in Chennai test motorists' patience

The new traffic diversions, implemented due to the construction of a flyover at Eldams Road and Thyagaraya Road junction along Anna Salai, caused confusion among motorists and pedestrians on Monday morning, the first working day after the diversions were put in place. Motorists complained of lack of adequate signs regarding the new routes and the narrow roads. A traffic jam which began along Thyagaraya Road caused stagnation till Nandanam, in which ambulances and a fire engine too were caught. Police then moved barricades to allow an ambulance to pass.

Sekar (35) of Saidapet, who was heading to Mount Road, said, "I knew there was a traffic diversion from Sunday. I thought there would be enough banners and other signs to guide motorists but there were only very few. I had to ask the traffic cops deployed there to get clarifications." During peak-hour traffic on Monday morning, Thyagaraya Road was packed to the brim with traffic flowing in from three directions — Nandanam, Eldams Road and a small lane from Anna Salai from the Gemini flyover direction. Even though the traffic was handled using a signal, the slow-moving traffic ended up causing a jam. One of the main reasons for the congestion on Thyagaraya Road was the incomplete removal of the centre median along the road. Stretches where the medians were removed had resulted in uneven ground and in some places, parts of the medians were left untouched resulting in traffic slow-down.

Apart from the two wheelers and cars, MTC buses too faced difficulties navigating the diversions. While turning into the narrow portions at North Boag Road and Vijayaraghava Road, the buses further slowed down traffic along already congested roads. Police sources said that the current flow of vehicles in the new route is being analysed and the next course of action will be decided.
