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
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Voice of GOD



Sri Siddha Natheswarar Temple, Thirunaraiyur

This is the 182nd Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and 65th Sthalam on the south side of river Kaveri in Chozha Nadu. Now this place is called Thirunaraiyur.

In Periya Puranam Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshipping Lord Shiva of Kudavayil.

Moolavar : Sri Siddha Natheswarar, Consort : Sri Soundaranayaki. Some of the salient features of this temple are.....

The temple faces West with a 5-tier Rajagopuram. Kambathadi Vinayagar, Dwajasthambam, and balipeedam are after the Rajagopuram. Moolavar is of swayambhu. In Koshtam Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy, Lingothbavar, Brahma and Durgai. In addition to this, the bas reliefs of Gorakkar, Sri Medhavi Maharishi, and "Sri Naranarayana Pakshi" worshipping Lord Shiva are on the sanctum sanctorum wall.

In Parkaram Vinayagar, Sri Valli Devasena Subramaniyar and Chandikeswarar. Sri Mahalakshmi (Sri Vanjula Devi) in stucco image. Sri ahalakshmi's avathara sthalam. Valampuri Vinayagar, Kasi Viswanathar with Visalakshi, Siddha Lingam, Rina Lingam, Vayu Lingam, Tejas Lingam, Jyothi Lingam, Nagammal, Suriyan, kala Bhairavar, Veera Bhairavar, Nalvar with Karaikal Ammaiyyar and Shaniswarar are in the maha mandapam and prakaram.

Ambal is in a separate temple like sannadhi. The face of Ambal looks childish.

The sanctum sanctorum consists of sanctum, antarala and artha mandapam. The mandapas are of Vavval nethi and are added at a later stage, maybe during Thanjavur Nayaks.

HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. The same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha Period and extended during Thanjavur Nayaks / Marathas.

The inscriptions recorded from this temple belong to Chozhas starting from Rajaraja-I to Kulothunga Chozha-III (Rajaraja-I, Veerarajendran-II, Kulothunga Chozha-I, II, III, Vikrama Chozha, Rajarajan-II, Rajathirajan-II). Of these Vikrama Chozha's inscriptions top the list. As per the inscriptions, this place was under Kshatriya Sigamani Valanattu Thirunaraiyur Nattu Thirunaraiyur and Kulothunga Chozha Vaalanattu Thirunaraiyur and Panchavan Mahadevi alias Chaturvedimangalam Thirunaraiyur. Lord Shiva was called as Siddheeswaramudayar. Rajaraja-I's period inscription starts with his meikeerthi records the endowment of Naivedyam at Manalinga Devar and Anavadiya Devar sannathis, for the same 52 veli land was gifted by the King Rajaraja. The temple was also called by his original name "Arumozhtheva Eswaram". This order was directly issued by Rajaraja.

Rajaraja-I's 2nd reign year inscription records the gift of a silver plate Plate, Pot, and a Chowry with a golden handle by Udaiyapirattiyar Sembian Mahadeviyar alias Pirantakam Mahadevadigalar to this temple Siddheeswaramudaya Mahadevar at Thirunaraiyur in Thirunaraiyur Nadu. The inscriptions record the endowment of Naivedyam to Pichadanar for which gold was gifted, A land was gifted by Manni Nattu Karuppur Udayan for feeding Sivayogiyar daily and lands were gifted for burning lamps at this temple, and a Pidari Amman Temple.

CM inaugurates the city's longest flyover

Chief Minister M.K. Stalin on Tuesday inaugurated the Usman Road – CIT Nagar flyover, built at a cost of Rs. 164.92 crore by Greater Chennai Corporation. The flyover was named 'J. Anbazhagan Flyover' in memory of the late T. Nagar MLA, at an event held on CIT Nagar Main Road, Chennai. The flyover, the first steel flyover, will connect South Usman Road and CIT Nagar Main Road in T. Nagar. It was constructed using 3,800 metric tonnes of steel. This flyover, which connects the ramp of the existing South Usman Road flyover on CIT Nagar First Main Road to CIT Nagar 4th Main Road junction, is designed to reduce traffic congestion at the junctions of South Usman Road – Burkit Road - Mambalam Road, South Usman Road - Southwest Boag Road - New Boag Road, and South Usman Road – CIT Nagar North Road.

The new flyover is 1,200 metres long and 8.40 metres wide, with 53 steel pillars. It is a two-lane road and has been seamlessly connected with the existing 800-metre concrete flyover on South Usman Road, using highend technology. The total length of this combined flyover is 2 km.

The event was attended by minister for municipal administration K.N. Nehru, minister for health and family welfare Ma. Subramanian, minister for Hindu religious and charitable endowments P.K. Sekar Babu, Mayor R.



Priya, MP A. Raja, MLAs J. Karunanidhi, Tha. Velu and Thayagam Kavi and others. After the inauguration, the Chief Minister walked along with the ministers on the flyover.



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Speed post modernises

The department of Posts is upgrading its speed post service, introducing enhanced digital security features and a revised tariff structure, effective Oct 1, 2025. The move aims to modernise the service and solidify its position against private courier companies. Features include :

OTP-Based service delivery : This service costs a nominal fee of Rs. 5 plus GST.

Registration Facility : Customers can opt for a secured delivery where the item is handed over exclusively to the designated addressee or an authorised person.

Digital Convenience : The service now includes online booking, online payment, real-time delivery updates and SMS notifications.

The Inland Speed Post tariff for documents has been revised for the first time since October 2012 to cover rising operational costs and invest in innovation.

New Base Rate : The charge for a document up to 50 gms sent locally is now Rs. 19.

Special Discounts : To increase accessibility, India Post is offering a 10% discount on the speed post tariff for students and a 5% discount for new bulk customers.

CMRL erects massive pier cap at Vadapalani

The Chennai Metro Rail Limited (CMRL) has successfully fixed a massive pier cap over the existing green line Metro station in Vadapalani as part of the phase II project. The work was completed in a record time of two months. The major hurdle was the 45m obligatory span of phase 1 corridor at this junction.

Conventional crane erection was not feasible due to traffic congestion and the presence of the operating corridor. Hence, a launching girder methodology was adopted to erect the Ugirders safely over this critical span.

With the higher rail level, the Vadapalani Metro station (Corridor-4) has been developed as a three-level structure including commercial, concourse and platform levels. This milestone stands as significant in the execution of elevated metro systems, achieved within the densely built-up stretch of Arcot Road, the CMRL said.

AROUND CHENNAI CITY

Man arrested for cheating woman

Virugambakkam All Women Police arrested a 25-year-old man named Harshavardhan on charges of rape. As per her complaint she was physically exploited by him and promising to marry her. Meanwhile, last week, Harshavardhan went to her home when she was alone and they had a physical relationship. After that, however, he cut off contact with her and stopped attending calls. Later, he refused to marry her, after which she approached the police. After she repeated pleading him to marry he avoided her. So she filed a cheating complaint against him.

The victim and the accused had known each other since their college days.

In 2019, the accused approached the woman, claiming that he was in love with her, which she believed. In November 2024, their families met and agreed to get them married in two years.

The accused was produced before a magistrate and remanded in judicial custody.

Complaint filed against defrauding

A police complaint has been filed against a man who allegedly defrauded people by accepting money on the pretext of buying them college seats.

Lakshmi Chandrakala, 49, from UI Colony, Kodambakkam, is an IT employee. She was introduced to Suman through her younger brother Alibai. Suman received Rs 6.16 lakh in December 2024, claiming to be buying a seat in a prestigious college for Lakshmi Chandrakala's daughter.

But after that, he cheated by not buying the college seat and not returning the money he had bought. Later, he returned only 2.5 lakh rupees.

He has committed fraud by not giving the remaining money.

Lakshmi Chandrakala has filed a complaint with the Kodambakkam police in this regard. The police are investigating the veracity of the complaint.

Land selected to build houses for squatters

It has been decided to build an apartment complex in Guindy, comprising 1,700 houses, for the residents of Saidapet and Jafferkhanpet areas along the banks of the Adyar River.

After the heavy rains and floods in 2015, people living along the banks of the Adyar River in Saidapet, Kotturpuram, and Jafferkhanpet areas were resettled in Kannagi Nagar and Perumbakkam areas.

For months, when trying to resettle, many people were reluctant to leave because of the distance. For the convenience of their work, there was a demand that the entire population should not be settled in one area, and that houses should be provided within 5 km of their place of residence.

For this, a location in Guindy has been selected. There is an 8-acre government-owned land in the Arulayanpet area of Adyar Zone, 168th Ward, Guindy. The government is planning to build an apartment complex with 1,700 houses on it; funds will be allocated soon.

Officials said that through this, people living along the banks of the Adyar River will be able to find homes here.

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Accident risk area

Motorists are suffering due to a ditch dug in the middle of the Bharathidasan Colony Main Road in K.K. Nagar to lay a sewage pipe. Bharathidasan Colony Main Road is located in Ward 138, K K Nagar, Kodambakkam Zone. A ditch was dug in the middle of Bharathidasan Colony Main Road to lay a sewage pipe from Ekattuthangal to K K Nagar Sewage Pumping Station.

Even though the pipe laying work has been completed, the pit has not been properly closed and only gravel has been dumped. The gravel is damaging the tires. In addition, motorists are suffering due to the slippery condition.

Therefore, motorists have requested that this road be repaired.

Incomplete work makes a regular traffic jam

Storm water work is incomplete in many areas of Ramapuram Main Road makes road jammed for hours. During peak hours its more worsening vehicles move like a snail and crawl for hours. This is a main junction for connectivity to Porur and Arcot Road. Due to ongoing storm-water drain works being carried out ahead of monsoon. Already notorious for traffic snarls, the road is used by hundreds of office goers heading various places to Airport, DLF, and other IT hubs this area is also surrounded by schools and colleges, says a resident of Ponnammal Nagar. Jayanthi a flower vendor who runs the shop says that the SWD project has going on for more than two months. "There is no coordination between Tangedco and the Chennai Corporation. The work is poorly planned. If they had coordinated earlier, the process would have been smoother. For over a month, I have lost a lot of business because customers simply could not come," she says.

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
