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# Voice of GOD



his is the 188th Thevara Padal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 71st sthalam on the south side of the river Kaveri of Chozha Nadu. This temple is on the southern banks of the river Mudikondan.

In Periyapuranam, Sekkizhar records that after getting bricks as gold at Thirupugalur, Sundarar went to Thiruvarur after worshiping Lord Shiva of Thirupanaiyur on the way and celebrated Panguni Uthiram Thiruvizha with Paravai Nachiyar. From Thiruvarur, Sundarar came to this temple. Sundarar and Vallalar have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple. Sundarar records that this temple was built by the Chozha King Ko Chengat Chozha. There are many types of temples, like Gajabirushta Vimana temple, Kara Koil, Kukudikoil, Perungoil, Mada Koil, etc. In this hymn, Sundarar records this temple as Perungoil.

Moolavar: Sri Madhuvaneswarar, Sri Prakasa Nathar, Sri Devaranyeswarar. Consort : Sri Madhuvaneswari, Sri Devakandhara Nayagi

Some of the salient features of this temple are..... The temple faces east without Rajagopuram. Dwajasthambam, Rishabam, and balipeedam are after the entrance and in front of Ambal Sannathi. Moolavar on the square avudayar worshiped by Brahma. In koshtam Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy, Lingothbavar, Brahma, and Durgai in the ground level. In the Upper level, only Dakshinamurthy.

In the praharam, Brahma worshiped Mahadeva Lingam, Agasthiyar worshiped Agastheeswarar, Vinayagar, Murugan with his consorts, Gajalakshmi, Somaskandar, Bhairavar, Suriyan, Saneeswarar, Chitragupta, Navagrahas, and Chandikeswarar. Chandikeswarar is with his wives. Only a picture of Natarajar is available in the Sabha mandapam. HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

This is one of the maada/Perungoil temples built by Ko Chenkat Chozhan, which has 18 steps. Sundarar also records the same in his hymns. Also, there are many types of temples like Gaja Birushta Vimana temple, Kara Koil, Kukudikoil, mada Koil, Perungoil, etc. In this hymn, Sundarar records this temple as

A 9th to 10th Century Rajakesari or Parakesari Varman's period inscription records the endowment of burning a perpetual lamp at this temple for which 12 Kalanju gold was gifted by one Naranan. The same was received by three people and agreed to burn from the interest earned. The first and last lines of the inscription were damaged. There is a mention of Thara Lamp in the last line. The other 18th to 19th-century inscriptions were damaged very heavily. Maha Kumbhabhishekam was conducted on 15th September 1996.

### LEGENDS

This place was called Madhuvanam, Devaranyam, Sundaravanam, and Birukathpuram during ancient times. Suriyan, Agasthiyar, and Devas (in the form of honey bees) worshiped Lord Shiva in the form of bees, not able to bear the torture of Viruthirasuran As per the legend, Lord Shiva turned Devas into honey bees and beehives in the form of the Shiva Linga. The Devas stayed inside the beehive Shiva Linga so that they would not be visible to the demon. Hence, this place was called Madhuvanam (Madhu is also called honey in Tamil), Lord Shiva was called "Madhuvaneswarar" and Ambal "Madhuvana Nayaki". It is believed that Indra worshiped Lord Shiva of this

temple to get relieved from the Brahmahathi dosha, due

to the killing of Viruthirasuran. Indra, Brahma, Suriyan

Sage Agasthiyar, and Devas in the form of honey bees

worshiped Lord Shiva of this temple.

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# **Battered road motorists suffer**



he 'patchwork' carried out on the road by the Corporation in a hurry has not been effective for even for a week, leading to motorists having to resort to dangerous situations. One such road is Jawaharlal Nehru Salai, 100 Feet Road.

The Chennai Corporation maintains 387 km of bus routes and 5,623 km of internal roads. Of these, 479 km of roads have been recently renovated.

Roads damaged: There are 283 km of roads in Chennai under the maintenance of the Highways Department. On many of these roads, metro railway construction work is going on, both underground and above ground. Due to this, major roads have been

The Corporation Roads have also been severely damaged due to the ongoing Metro Railway works at many places.

In these areas, as a precautionary measure against the northeast monsoon, emergency 'patch work' has been carried out on damaged roads by the Corporation and Highways Department contractors.

Because the work was carried out on damp roads with low-quality tar mixtures, they did not last even two days.

In many places, new asphalt has shifted and potholes have formed. Gravel is scattered around. Drivers are having to navigate through these as if they were trying to escape.

The advisory states that there will be rain until December. Therefore, even if the road cannot be completely laid, the public is urging the government to take steps to construct 'patchwork' roads that will at least last for two months.

In this situation, the Highways Department said that discussions are underway to use modern machinery to dry out the moisture on damaged roads and construct 'badge work' roads.



## **Consumers** can file complaints if overcharged

mid growing complaints over unusually high A mid growing complaints over anasam, and a electricity bills across Tamil Nadu, the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board (TNEB) has assured consumers that the issue will be addressed promptly through both online and offline complaint mechanisms.

Electricity bills in the state are collected once every two months, with 100 units offered free of cost and subsidised rates for up to 200 units. However, consumers using over 300 to 350 units fall under higher tariff slabs. Officials explained that meter reading delays of 3 to 6 days in some areas have led to additional units being counted, resulting in inflated bills during the September and November cycles.

TNEB has advised affected consumers to file complaints through the official website www.tangedco.gov.in under the "Consumer Grievance" section, or by contacting the helpline 1912. Complaints can also be made in person at the respective division offices. To ensure speedy resolution, special officers have been appointed in every zone, and the Board has warned of strict action against employees responsible for

Officials have urged the public to check their bills carefully and report any discrepancies without delay to avoid overpayment and ensure accurate consumption

### **Bookings for trains begin for Pongal festival**

dvance ticket bookings for trains to return home during the Pongal festival in January began Tuesday. In 2026, A Bhogipandikai will be celebrated on January 13, Thai Pongal on the 14th, Mattupongal on the 15th, and Uzhavar Thirunal on the 16th. Due to this, it is common for hundreds of thousands of people from various cities, including Chennai, to return to their hometowns. Those who have the opportunity to take leave on Monday, January 12th, will plan to leave on Friday, the 9th.

Advance booking of tickets for travel on January 9 began Tuesday, with the facility to book tickets 60 days in advance for express trains. Advance booking is being done at ticket counters at railway stations and through the IRCTC portal. Southern Railway officials said: People are making advance reservations as they can make reservations 60 days before the train journey. It is expected that more people will pre-register on Nov. 13 and 14. Similarly, those who will be baptized on Jan. 17 and 18 after the Pongal festival is over will pre-register on the 18

Steps will be taken to connect waiting seats and passenger compartments to accommodate the needs of the passengers. Special trains will be announced by the end of December.

### Land grabbing three arrested

He absconded after failing to appear for the hearing at the Saidapet court. Following this, the court issued an arrest warrant on the 25th of last month.

### 5 sovereign snatched police on hunt

My son had his semester exam on the 6th. His class coordinator, Smt., called me on my mobile phone and told me that Vasudevan was very depressed and that she was sending him home with two students.

As soon as he got home, he made a video call and asked me to show him around. When I asked him what happened, Vasudevan said that he was denied permission to write the exam because he was using his mobile phone in the exam room and was made to sit

I don't know what happened there, to the point where they left my son alone and took his own life.

While the lecturer was speaking, Srimati repeatedly advised, 'Don't ask him anything; watch him carefully.' I wonder what the reason for that is.

Therefore, the college and the lecturer, Mrs., are responsible for my son's death. Therefore, legal action should be taken against them.

This is what he said in the complaint. The police are investigating the matter.

# **Councillors** meeting held

he Kodambakkam Zonal Committee meeting, chaired by its chairman Krishnamoorthy, was held at the Zonal Office. The councilors spoke as follows:

Kannan, DMK, 138th Ward: Elections are coming up. Only if we complete the work quickly, we will be able to meet the people. If we win by winning votes, it means that you, the officials, have acted correctly

Ravi Shankar, DMK, 129th Ward: It seems like the rain has run away from us because we were prepared for the rainy season. In areas including Virugambakkam and Vadapalani, there are a large number of elderly people living along the roads. Arrangements should be made to shift them to old age homes. There is no space in the ward to dump garbage including sofas and mattresses collected from house to house; this should be created. Voter registration is slow. Steps should be taken to complete it quickly within the specified time.

Dhanasekar, DMK, 137th Ward: Due to water supply and sewerage work, it was not possible to construct a road on 11th Street in Choolaipallam, MGR Nagar. Now that the work has been completed and the road has been handed over, an estimate needs to be prepared to construct the road quickly.

Uma Anand, BJP, 134th Ward: Vehicles are parked on both sides, occupying 20 - 25 feet of the road in West Mambalam. This causes congestion. The government announced to provide RO units in all schools. But it did not allocate funds to maintain it.

Stella, DMK, 128th Ward: There has been an increase in roadside shops in the ward. Someone is charging money for them. It should be controlled. The lighting is poor. It needs to be replaced. A contract has been awarded to maintain the park, but no staff has been appointed for the work.

Sridhar, DMK, 140th Ward: The work to improve 'Amma' Park on behalf of CMDA was started last July. But the work has not been done. The opposition parties are accusing us of stopping the work. Thus they spoke. At the meeting, 20 resolutions were passed.

# GCC to increase councilors fund

The Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) will increase the councillor's fund to 80 lakh to improve waste management. Valasaravakkam Zone (XI) Chairperson V. Rajan called for an increase in the allocation from 60 lakh to 80 lakh, and use of additional funds for purchasing bobcats (compact loading vehicles), to curb open dumping. "These machines will reduce the need for manpower, and could be helpful during floods," Mr. Rajan said.

He recommended the increase when asked how they would meet the operational and maintenance costs of the machinery at the recent council meeting. He further said the machines in the current fleet were inadequate, and that bobcats were in high demand across various zones as they could be used to clear construction debris and desilt canals.

The GCC assigns one vehicle per unit, covering five wards, but these vehicles are often sent to different locations based on complaints.

"When a complaint reaches the Commissioner, the vehicle is sent to that location. If the Mayor receives another, it is sent elsewhere," he said. Councillors have raised concern that the shortage of machinery hindered swift response and delayed removal of debris. Deputy Mayor M. Magesh Kumaar pointed out that the GCC had promised to deploy a bobcat for each ward, but had failed to do so. Mayor R. Priya acknowledged the growing demand for vehicles and equipment related to cleaning operations.

Chennai Collector Rashmi Siddharth Jagade has said that pink autos, which are meant to be driven only by women, will be confiscated if driven by men. Chief Minister Stalin launched the 'Pink Auto' scheme, operated by women for women, to ensure the safety of women.

Under this scheme, more than 200 women in Chennai have been provided with autos that run on compressed natural gas (CNG).

Statement issued by Chennai Collector Rashmi Siddharth Jagade: Following a complaint that men were driving pink autos, social welfare officials conducted an investigation for a few days. # Residents fumes dumping of garbage in the vacant land

The board officials are unhappy with the corporation dumping garbage and construction waste without permission at the vacant land of the K K Nagar Housing Board. They have filed a complaint with the police regarding this violation.

The Housing Board residence was located on Rajamannar Road, K.K. Nagar, Kodambakkam Zone. The 160 houses here were completely demolished a few years ago due to damage. An estimate for a new residential project has been prepared and sent to the government.

Since the area where the residence was demolished was a depression, rainwater accumulated in it, breeding mosquitoes. In addition, sewage mixed with it and gave off a foul smell. To prevent the health problems caused by this, the corporation leveled the pit by pouring soil into it.

In this situation, the Corporation is dumping construction waste and garbage collected from various places at this location without the permission of the



Housing Board. This is causing inconvenience to the residents living around this area.

Board officials said: As water stagnation was reported to be causing health problems, permission was given to the corporation officials to level the area by pouring soil. But the corporation has illegally turned it into a dumping ground for construction waste and garbage.

A complaint has been filed at the K.K. Nagar police station in this regard.

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# Case filed to remove MGR statue in front of Varashakthi Vinayagar Temple

The Madras High Court has ordered the Corporation to respond to a petition seeking the removal of the MGR statue located in front of the Varashakthi Vinayagar Temple in Nesappakkam.

A petition filed in the Madras High Court by M. Gopal of Virugambakkam: There is a old Varashakthi Vinayagar temple in Nesappakkam. A large number of devotees visit this temple every day.

The temple was consecrated in 2017. The temple's Rajagopuram and flagpole are very famous.

In this situation, for the past 20 years, statues of political party leaders had been placed in front of the temple, obscuring its view. Statues of Kamaraj, Anna, and MGR were placed without any permission from the Chennai Corporation.

Subsequently, a meeting was held with the relevant political party leaders regarding the removal of the statues.

In it, it was unanimously decided to remove all three statues from there. The Kamaraj statue was removed by the Congress party and the Anna statue was removed by the DMK party.

But MGR did not just remove the statue. Subsequently, a petition was continuously submitted to the Corporation since 2017 to remove the statue. Some loyalists is opposing the removal of the statue.
