Temple, Karukudi

This is the 186th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and 69th sthalam on the south side of the river Kaveri in Chozha Nadu. Now this place is called Marudanallur or Marudhantha Nallur. But Thirugnanasambandar refers to this place as Karukkudi. The Enathi Natha Nayanar, one of the 63 Nayanmars, belongs to Enanalloor, which is near this place.

Thirugnanasambandar and Vallalar have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple. Thirugnanasambandar's visit to this temple in his Purana in Periya Puranam is not traceable. Moolavar : Sri Karukudinathar, Sri Bramhapureeswarar, Sri Sargunalingeswarar. Consort : Sri Advaitha Nayagi, Sri Kalyana Nayagi. Some of the salient features of this temple are..... The temple faces east with an entrance arch. Rishabam and Balipeedam are in front of the Sanctum Sanctorum. A Stucco image of Shiva and Parvati is on the arch and entrance of the Sanctum. Vinayagar and Murugan Sannidhis are at the entrance of the sanctum sanctorum. Moolavar is believed to be made of mud by Sri Rama, and hence, abhishekam is not done to moolavar. Abhishekam will be done after covering the Shiva Linga with a Kavasam. Avudayar is of stone. In Koshtam, Narthana Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy with 2 sanakathi munis, Lingothbavar with Maha Vishnu

In praharam, Dwara Ganapathy, Bala Murugan, Saneeswarar is Bala Saneeswaran, A Shiva Linga Sannathi, a Rishabam, Chandikeswarar, Navagrahas, Chandran, Suryan, Hanumantha Linga, Pandya King Sargunan, and his minister. Ambal is in a standing posture in Kalyana kolam. The Ambal Sannathi is on the right side of the main sanctum Sanctorum facing east. An image of Dhananjayan worshiping in a worshiping posture.

and Brahma on both sides, Brahma and Durgai.

ARCHITECTURE

The sanctum Vimanam is a little taller. Veena Dakshinamurthy is on the Vimana.

HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. Later, the same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period. Further extended during the Thanjavur Nayakas period and maintained by Nattukottai Nagarathars.

The inscriptions recorded from this temple belong to Rajaraja-I and Kulothunga Chozha-III. Rajarajan-I's 2nd reign year inscription records Lord Shiva's name as Vizhumiya Nayanar, and this place was under Kulothunga Chozha Valanattu Thirunaraiyur Nadu. Thiruvathavur Nayanar (Manickavasagar) was established by a Devaradiyar Karaiyerivittal Thirunattaperumal of Visveswarar temple at Chennimangalam, and also gave gifts for daily worship. Maha Kumbhabhishekam was conducted on 06th July 2003 and 11th June 2011, after maintenance. LEGENDS

It is believed that Brahma, Hanuman, Rama, Pandya King Sarguna, and his minister worshiped Lord Shiva of this temple. Since Brahma worshiped, Lord Shiva is called Brahmapureeswarar. And Lord Shiva is also called Sarguna Lingeswarar, since the Pandya King Sargunan was worshiped. During exile, Rama with Sita, and Lakshman stayed here for some time. For doing pooja, Rama asked Hanuman to bring a Shiva Linga from Kasi. Since it was delayed and pooja time was going to end, Rama made a Shiva Linga out of mud and completed the Pooja.

Animal lovers have welcomed the move. "Though pets require less space than humans, there's always an issue of availability in burial grounds. Cremation solves that problem".





Vacant land a nightmare for locals

Lying in the heart of the city, it is worth crores of rupees. But for the neighbours, this vacant piece of land near Model Hutment Road CIT Nagar a garbage

pile, an open toilet, an ideal breeding place for mosquitoes and a hub for drinkers at night.

The city corporation has placed bins there, but the garbage is almost always thrown on the land. Even city corporation workers were seen dumping non-recyclable wastes on the ground, taking only wastes such as paper and bottles to the nearby mart to be sold. Making matters worse, auto drivers nearby use the land as a toilet. Over the years, the garbage there has become an ideal home for rodents, mosquitoes and stray dogs. If this is not enough, at night the place becomes a haunt for drinkers, and even those using narcotic substances, allege locals.

"There are hundreds who live in the neighbourhood. With dengue at its peak, we recommend all our patients to clear their houses and ensure there is no space for mosquito breeding. But this open land gives more opportunity than all the nearby houses combined," says Arun, who used to live there till a year ago. "A private party owns this land, but the public always throw the waste there despite dustbins being placed," said.

Additionally, the corporation announced that owners who take their pets out without a collar will face a fine of Rs. 500. It also emphasized that pet owners must not allow their pets to defecate in public places. These measures aim to promote responsible pet ownership and maintain cleanliness in the city.

Metro water board keeps vehicles, supplies ready for monsoon work



A s city agencies commence monsoon preparations, the Metro Water Board has started the operations to manage water supply and sewage handling during the Northeast monsoon. Aside from stationing 695 vehicles for sewage-related work across all 15 zones with 2,149 field workers, the Metro Water Board is also coordinating with Chennai Corporation to provide two water tanks per facility for 106 kitchens and 210 relief centres established across the city

The department has requested that the public contact the toll-free number 1916 or dial 044-45674567 for queries and complaints related to water supply and sewage. Its control room functions round the clock to resolve complaints.

The Metro Water Board has 299 desilting vehicles, 181 jet rodding vehicles, 45 jetting cum sucker vehicles, 73 super sucker vehicles, three sewer lorries, and three bandicoot robot vehicles at its disposal for monsoon operations. It also rents more vehicles for sewage removal from other district, and provides 84 vehicles to the Corporation for civic works from October 15. The city has 390 sewage pumping stations, all equipped with generators. The amount of treated sewage reached 825.47 MLD on Oct 22. The drinking water supply is managed by nine treatment plants and supported by 132 water

distribution stations. On Oct 22, a total of 1,225.54 MLD of drinking water was distributed across the city. Distribution is facilitated by 454 drinking water supply vehicles. The department also stocks 100 MT of Sulphate Alumino Ferric (Alum), 73 MT of bleaching powder, 67 MT of lime, 2 lakh litres of Hypochlorite solution, 190 MT of liquid Chlorine and 45 lakh Chlorine tablets for water purification.



Mega cleanliness drive and awareness rally

2 arrested for stealing gold jewellery in Valasaravakkam

Madhavaramu, 32, a Tanishq Jewellery manager in Valasaravakkam as usual on 24th when he was checking the gold jewellery in his store, he was shocked to find out covering jewellery in a box containing a gold chain. According to complaint to police. It was revealed that Lokesh, 26, a jewellery shop employee, and his friend Gautham, 29, were involved in the exchange of covering jewellery.

As per the plan given by Lokesh, who was working at the shop, his friend Gautham went to the jewellery store as a customer. Investigation revealed that he then distracted the other employees, left the covering jewellery behind, and stole two gold chains worth 19 sovereigns.

The police arrested Lokesh and Gautam and seized 19 sovereign chains from them.

Man hacked to death in broad day light in Ashok Nagar

A 38-year-old man was hacked to death by a gang in broad daylight near Ashok Nagar on Wednesday. Police have arrested three persons including two women in connection with the murder. The arrested persons have been identified as Dhananchezhiyan (42), a transport corporation staff, and his wife, Suganya (37) and Gunasundari (27).

The deceased was identified as A Prakash of Puducherry. Preliminary investigations revealed that he had come to the city for a business deal. Prakash was said to be in an illicit relationship with Dhanachezhian's wife, Suganya, who was his classmate from school. Gunasundari had informed Dhanachezhian about Prakash's movements. Police sources said that Prakash had parked his car on Ashok Nagar 4th avenue and was talking with Suganya when her husband and his associates ganged up and rained blows on him and fled the scene.

Onlookers who witnessed the incident alerted the authorities who rushed to the scene and secured Prakash and moved him to the ESI hospital in K K Nagar. Doctors at the hospital had declared Prakash as brought dead after which Ashok Nagar Police moved Prakash's body to the government hospital for post mortem.

Teenage girls rescued after parents complaints

Two teenage girls, aged 14 and 15, from T. Nagar, are studying in 10th standard and Plus 1 respectively after being criticized by their parents for using their mobile phones for too long.

They both decided to leave home. Their parents after searching for long time they were not able to fine these two girls following this parents filed a police complaint at the Pondy Bazaar police station. After some information police found them at Parangimalai railway station.

Police reached the spot, rescued the girls and handed them over to their parents.

Two arrested for defrauding elderly man

The Chennai Central Crime Branch police arrested two people, including a private bank assistant manager, in a case of fraud of Rs 44 lakhs. Pattabi, 83, from Virugambakkam was contacted by the fraudster claimed to be from Mumbai Police through whatsup under the

pretext of 'digital arrest'.

He blackmailed the elderly man, claiming that he was involved in illegal money transactions, and extorted Rs

The Chennai Central Crime Branch police investigated and have already arrested Lakshmanan, 38, and Madi Sivakumar, 41, from Sholingar, Ranipet district.

In this situation, the police arrested two persons, Ramachandramurthy, 30, a private bank manager from Anna Salai, and Mohammed Mushfiq, 20, who had created various bank accounts to receive fraudulent money.

Three drug addicts arrested for attacking EB worker

Three people were arrested on last Saturday night who attacked an electricity board employee in T Nagar. The arrested were Anand, 22, a two-wheeler mechanic from Singaravelan Nagar, Thiruvanmiyur, Rohit, 21, a car driver from Jayaraman Street, Thiruvanmiyur, and Diwakar, 20, from Velachery.

Arulselvam, 29, from Vijayaraghavapuram, Saligramam, has been working as a temporary employee at the Mambalam Substation on Singaravelu Street, T. Nagar for past two years.

On the day of attack he was closing the shutters of the substation and working inside. At that time, he heard a loud noise outside.

When he went there, and found out five drunken people arguing among themselves. Arulselvam intervened and asked them to leave the place. Enraged, by that they attacked Arulselvam with stones and their hands and escaped.

Arulselvam, who was seriously injured, received treatment at a nearby private hospital. Following a complaint, the Mambalam police investigated the matter and arrested three of them.
