Motorists suffers to negotiate this stretch in Valasaravakkam



A poorly designed silt catch pit for storm water drains (SWD) located in the middle of Arcot Road, in Valasaravakkam has emerged as a serious safety hazard for motorists, particularly two-wheeler riders.

As one of Chennai's key arterial stretches linking Arcot Road, Valasaravakkam to Porur with heavy traffic throughout the day, Arcot Road is already choked with problems due to its limited width and damage caused by the Metro Rail construction along several sections.

Thirukkannapuram

This is the 194th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 77th Sthalam on the south side of the river Kaveri of Chozha Nadu. This place is now called Thirukkannapuram. This place was called Rama Nandheecharam, which was corrupted into Ramanatheecharam. This temple place is part of Thirukkannapuram.

In Periyapuram, Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva of Thiruchengattankudi. In that he didn't mention this temple in particular, instead mentioned other Shiva temples on the way.

Moolavar : Sri Ramanatheeswarar, Consort : Sri Soolikambal, Sri Sarivar Kuzhalai.

Some of the important features of this temple are..... The temple faces east with a recently built entrance arch. Balipeedam and Rishabam are in front of the Sanctum Sanctorum. There is an arch at the entrance of the sanctum with stucco images of Shiva's family. Moolavar is a little big and tall on a big circumference avudayar. (Jyothi can be seen on the moolavar during harathi). In koshtam Dakshinamurthy, Lingothbavar, Brahma, and Durgai.

In the outer prakaram, Vinayagar, Subramaniar, Gajalakshmi, Kala Bhairava, Suriyan, and Chandran. Chandikeswarar is in the inner prakaram.

The urchavar Somaskandar is kept at Thirupugalur for safety reasons. Nandhi is in the hands of Ambal, and there is a legend associated with this.

The 15th-century Saint Arunagirinathar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Muruga of this temple.

ARCHITECTURE

The temple complex consists of the sanctum sanctorum, antarala, artha mandapam, and a mukha mandapam. A 3-tier vesara Vimana is over the sanctum.

HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. The same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period and further extended during the Thanjavur Nayaks / Marathas.

As per the inscriptions Lord Shiva was called Rama Nandheechara mudayar, Ramanatheecharamudayar. Kulothunga Chozha gave a gift to a Village called Sivapadasekara Mangalam for worship at this temple.

Rajarajan-III's 16th-year inscription records that Rajathirajavalanattu Thaniyur PerumpaRRappuliur Temple (Chidambaram Temple) officials and this temple officials assembled at Devan Thiru mandapam took some decision regarding ... 50 Veli land was gifted to this temple to celebrate 2 Brahmotsavam in a year, Monthly festival and to meet required expenses for naivedyam, poojas. In addition to that it was felt that the nivandhams / wages to the people working in the temple were very low and arrangements were made to increase the same. To meet this it was decided that all the temple officials depending on the status belonging to Chozha mandalam, Rajaraja Pandiya Mandalam, Naduvil Nadu, and Thondai Mandalam have to give some amount through Madams if not through the Village sabhas.

Kulothunga Chozha-III's 10th reign year inscription records that the temple was reconstructed (maybe as a stone temple) on the same place, ThirumuRRam (inner prahara) and Thirumadaivalakam (the place around the temple) and donation if 1/4 land and 5 Veli land to this temple for worship and pooja.

Gold jewellery missing from locker

The police who arrested him seized 1.5 kg of cannabis and 2,240 narcotic pills that were being sold.

Police raid hotel in Valasaravakkam

Police raided at a hotel in Valasaravakkam and arrested a gang of 17 people involved in gambling. They seized Rs 10,500, 26 mobile phones, and 'playing coins' worth Rs 3.68 lakh from them.

The arrested persons were handed over to the Valasaravakkam L&O. Further investigation on.

Police personal transferred for not taking action on sexual harassment

Four inspectors, including the Women's Police Inspector, who failed to take appropriate action in the sexual harassment were transferred to the waiting list on Tuesday. It was said that a 7th class student who was traveling in a government bus in Valasaravakkam was allegedly sexually assaulted by a passerby on 19th of this month. There were allegations that the Valasaravakkam Women's Police did not properly investigate the case and arrested the culprit.

As a result, several members of the All India Democratic Women's Association along with the student's parents, staged a road blockade in front of the Valasaravakkam police station, demanding the arrest of the culprit.

In response to this, Valasaravakkam Women's Police Inst., Anandi, has been transferred to the waiting list as per the orders of Commissioner Arun.

Synthetic drugs seized

College students, were arrested for possession of synthetic drugs in K K Nagar on Tuesday. Police seized about 7.5 grams from them.

Police received a tip-off that drugs were being sold near a tea shop on Munusamy Road in West K K Nagar. Acting on the information, anti narcotic bureau, along with K K Nagar police, intercepted five youths loitering suspiciously. As they gave contradictory replies, police searched and seized methamphetamine and other related drugs.

The arrested persons were identified as P Aravindan, 20, P Christopher, 18, R Manoj, 19, V Mugilan, 21 and U Gunachandran 21. It was found out that these teenagers procured the drug from Bangalore based person as Habib. The arrested students are from various private college students.

A case has been registered. The arrested five suspects were produced before a magistrate court in the city and remanded in judicial custody. Further investigation is on.

Couple lost Rs 75,000 in digital arrest

The police are probing a complaint from a couple in Vadapalani who lost Rs 75,000 to cyber fraudsters impersonating officials of the High Commission in London who claimed that their daughter, who is studying in London, was under 'digital arrest'.

Digital arrest involves scammers calling potential targets posing as law enforcement officers, typically from the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), Research and Analysis Wing (RAW), Mumbai Police, among others and fabricating a scenario to instil fear and create panic in the minds of the person at the other end of the line.

On Sunday evening, the complainant, Banumathi (49) of Vadapalani, had received a call in which the callers mentioned her daughter's education credentials and claimed that she was caught up in a multi-million dollar fraud case and demanded that she make an initial payment of Rs 75,000. When the caller demanded more money, the woman informed her husband, who made inquiries and found that they were a victim of cyber fraud and approached the city police.

A senior police officer with Tamil Nadu Police's Cyber Crime wing said that, in 2025, as many as 1,203 complaints from Tamil Nadu were registered in the National Cyber Crime Reporting (NCRP) portal regarding 'Digital Arrest'.

Student Aadhaar number linked to Pondicherry, father files complaint

Krishnamoorthy, 35, is a daily wage labourer from West Namachivayam Street, Choolaimedu. His daughter Madhumita, 14, studying at the GHSS in the same area. The student from Tamil Nadu is struggling to link her Aadhaar number at school because her Aadhaar number is linked to Pondicherry.

This school had difficulty linking the student's Aadhaar number to the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE) platform. Similarly, there was a problem in linking the Aadhaar number with the family cardholder card.

When the student's father Krishnamurthy inquired at the nearest e-service center regarding this, it was revealed that the student's Aadhaar number was linked to Pondicherry.

That is, Madhumita's name and date of birth were found to be along with someone else's parent's name and photo.

Following this, Krishnamurthy has repeatedly complained to the Aadhaar center officer in Koyambedu for the past four months to change his Aadhaar number, but no action has been taken so far.

As a result, Krishnamoorthy, who came to the Chennai Collector's office, submitted a petition to Deputy Collector Vetrikumaran requesting that his daughter's Aadhaar number be changed.



Voter list special camp

A special camp will be conducted on Saturday and Sunday in the Chennai district to add names to the voter list.

Chennai Corporation statement: The draft voters' list was published on the 19th. The acceptance and rejection of the list will continue till the 18th of January. To facilitate eligible citizens to apply, special camps will be held at 4,079 polling stations on Saturdays and Sundays, January 27th and 28th, and January 3rd and 4th.

In this, eligible persons who have completed 18 years of age can submit Form - 6. Also, those whose names

are in the electoral roll of an assembly constituency can submit Form - 7 to raise objection to the admission.

Those who wish to change their identity card or to be marked as differently-abled voters may fill out and submit Form - 8. It states thus.

Recent spells of rain has worsened road conditions. In response, the Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) relaid a crucial stretch between the Alwarthirunagar and Valasaravakkam. However, the relaid surface sits over the silt catch pit of the SWD, creating what commuters describe as an artificial pothole.

As the structure is positioned in the middle of the carriageway, two-wheeler riders are frequently destabilised while crossing the stretch, increasing the risk of skidding and accidents. Parthasarathy a resident of Chowdry Nagar says that, "The location of the pit is a design flaw; it's right in the middle of the road, which destabilises two-wheelers and makes riding extremely uncomfortable, leading to accidents."

Shop owners along the stretch have also raised concerns over repeated relaying of the road. Somu, who runs a shop nearby, said the road level has been rising steadily over the years. "Even though milling was done before relaying, it has not been effective. Now the road is almost at the same level as my shop entrance. If this continues, my shop will be submerged during even for a small rains," he said.

Residents and commuters have urged the Corporation to take immediate corrective measures, including redesigning the SWD structure and ensuring safer road levels, to prevent accidents and further inconvenience on the busy stretch.

Virugambakkam canal bridge to be pulled down, rebuilt by CMRL to prevent flooding

A bridge across the Virugambakkam canal on Kaliyamman Koil Street may soon be demolished and rebuilt to prevent flooding along the Chennai Metro Rail Phase - 2 corridor under construction. CMRL, which is building an elevated metro line along the 3.5 km busy stretch of Kaliyamman Koil Street, has floated a tender for the demolition and reconstruction of the bridge.

The Phase-2 metro line along Kaliyamman Koil Street, which will connect Koyambedu and Alwarthirunagar as part of the 44.6 km Corridor-5, is expected to be completed by June 2026.

The Virugambakkam canal runs for 6.36 km through Virugambakkam, Arumbakkam and Aminjikarai before joining the Cooum river. It has 28 bridges facilitating vehicular movement.

The civic body has also identified 12 bridges that obstruct water flow during the monsoon for demolition and reconstruction as arch bridges.

AYUDH – UNiTE campaign to end digital violence

Corporation to take up road improvement works at 8.7 cr.

The Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) has planned speed breaker repairs, thermoplastic road-marking works, installation of caution boards, and traffic improvement works across Zones 2 to 15 in the city.

The civic body has floated tenders for the works estimated to cost 8.73 crore. Ramamurthy a long time resident of 10th Sector says that several speed breakers in the city were in a poor condition, and some of the most dangerous structures were located near schools, including on P.T. Rajan Road and near a private school in K.K. Nagar. The Chennai Corporation has floated tenders covering Kodambakkam (85 lakh), Valasaravakkam (51 lakh) zones.

When asked about a survey to audit faulty speed breakers, civic officials said several projects have been delayed due to the Special Intensive Revision exercise related to the Assembly election in 2026, and that the audit was under way and being addressed.

Corpn to issue sales certificates for street vendors

To streamline and regulate footpath vending activities, the Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) has decided to issue sales certificates to authorised street vendors soon. Along with this, the Corporation has announced a revised annual fee structure, aimed at ensuring transparency and uniformity in vendor charges.

Under the new system, annual fees will vary based on space occupied and type of vending activity. Vendors using more than 25 sq. ft. will pay 3,000 per year, while mobile vendors without a fixed location will pay 1,500 annually. Full-time permanent vendors will be charged 1% to 3% of the government guideline value, with minimum fees ranging from 750 to 3,000. Part-time vendors will pay lower rates, starting from 375, while head-load vendors will pay a nominal 250 per year.

The GCC said the revised fee model will help formalise street vending, provide official recognition to vendors, and ensure better urban management across Chennai.

Innovative experiment

Focus on amenities too, say rail passengers after fare increase

The Indian Railways on Sunday announced the decision to increase the train fare from December 26 to earn Rs 600 crore revenue. Passengers and rail activists in Chennai say the increase was nominal and that Railways should focus on proper maintenance and better amenities in the trains.

With the revision in pricing, passengers will pay 1 paisa/km for ordinary class more than 215 km, for mail/express non-AC/AC, the revised price is 2 paisa/km. For instance, a 500-km journey in non-AC coaches, passengers will have to pay Rs 10 extra. There is no increase in suburban and monthly season ticket fares. And no increase up to 215 km in ordinary class.

"The increase in price is very nominal; so it wouldn't adversely impact passengers. However, when price is increased, Railways must ensure proper maintenance of facilities in trains like toilet and drinking water, and also disinfect the trains," opined Dayanand Krishnan, a transportation activist.

Concurring with him was Naveen Chander, a rail enthusiast, who pointed out: "The increase is reasonable to manage the rising operating costs, salaries and pension along with the need to fund the essential infrastructure projects without relying on centre's assistance."

The need to improve basic amenities like platforms, public announcement system, lighting, and seaters for passengers could not be emphasised enough. "For instance, in the Chennai division, suburban stations have not implemented proper housekeeping," said K Baskar, former member of Divisional Railway Users Consultative Committee (DRUCC).
