Residents opine that the rains have dented most roads. Several of the roads have been dug up for line department work. SSR Pankajam Road is one of the major linking roads in Saligramam locality and must be relayed faster, residents opine. We are much worried about the safety of our children who pass these roads

There are many stones lying on the road and a fastmoving vehicle is enough to send one of them flying to hit someone in their face or head. The vehicle movement on the road is high during peak hours. It is a breaking ride for all of them, complains a parent on anonymity.

Sewage related work was carried out earlier, and only if this road is fixed we residents will be happy, they said. Road that is used by all residents of the area has been in a bad state for a long. They should relay this stretch first,

says Godavari, a long time resident. There should be better coordination from all departments in addressing civic issues, she added.

## **Voice of GOD**



#### Soundareswarar Temple, Thirupanaiyur

This is the 190th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 73rd Sthalam on the south side of the river Kaveri of Chozha Nadu. This place was called Thalavanam (Palm tree forest), and the temple is called Thalavaneswaram.

In Periyapuranam, Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva Thiyagaraja of Thiruvarur. Sundarar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva and got Gold in the form of bricks to celebrate Panguni Uthiram at Thiruvarur with Paravai Nachiyar. Thirugnanasambandar, Sundarar, Manickavasagar, and Vallalar have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple.

Moolavar: Sri Soundareswarar, Sri Azhahiyanathar, Sri Thalavaneswarar. Consort: Sri Brukanthanayagi, Sri Periya Nayagi.

Some of the important features of this temple are as follows.

The temple faces east with an entrance arch/
Rajagopuram base with stucco images of
Rishabarooder at the center. A balipeedam and
Rishabam are immediately after the entrance arch. In
Koshtam Agasthiyar, Parasara maharishi,
Dakshinamurthy, Maha Vishnu, Brahma, and Durgai.
In praharam, Thunai Iruntha Vinayagar (for Karikal
Chozhan), Martruraitha Vinayagar (similar to
Thiruvarur), Subramaniar, Chandikeswarar,
Mahalakshmi (Stucco images), Shiva Lingas worshiped
by Sapta Rishis, Somaskandar (a different one with
fruit in left hand), and Chandikeswarar. A small
sannathi of Thalavaneswarar Temple (Sri
Panagatteeswarar Temple ) is also in the prakaram.
ARCHITECTURE

The main temple consists of the Sanctum sanctorum, antarala, artha mandapam, and a Mukha mandapam. The adhistanam is of prati banda adhistanam with Vrutha kumudam. The Prastaram is with valapi, kapotam, and Viyyalavari. An eka thala dravida Vimanam is over the sanctum.

#### HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. The same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period (11th Century) and extended during the Pandyas and Vijayanagara periods. It is believed that Karikarchozha was brought up in this place.

There are about 14 inscriptions recorded from this temple. These inscriptions belong to Kulothunga Chozha-I, Rajathi Rajan-II, Sundara Pandyan, Parakrama Pandyan, Rajara Rajan-I, and Rajarajan-II. As per the inscriptions, the place was called Rajendra Chozha Panaiyur, and Lord Shiva was called Panayadiappan, Panangattiraivan, etc.

Vikrama Pandyan's 5th reign year inscription records the endowments of land and house lands gifted to the Adhi Chandeswarar temple.

Sundara Pandya period inscription records that there was a sandhi / kattalai in the name of the king, for naivedyam, 5 veli land was gifted to this temple. This is a copy of the old inscription, and the inscription's last word finishes with Thulyam (copy).

Rajathirajan-II's 10th reign year inscription records the gift of land as irayili to the Azhagu Devar by Chozha Panaiyur NattuKon and Kotramangalamudayan Adalvallan.

# Water stagnation and traffic jam a cause of worry



Even though no heavy rains yet this monsoon the stagnation of water in Erikarai Road in Nesapakkam has left residents struggling as these localities lack proper stormwater drains, sewers and garbage disposal systems. Stagnation water make motorists in trouble in Erikarai Road mostly peak

hours.

Many of the areas are low lying and in the absence of drains, water stagnates for long. Since the corporation lacks proper drains, the sewage dumped in open areas mixes with rainwater posing a public health hazard. says Stephen a long time resident of Rajiv Gandhi Nagar. Concern officials have started working on this water stagnation. Virugambakkam MLA, Prabhakar Raja after hearing visited the spot immediately and supervised the work taken by GCC

This place is always having stagnant water and surrounded by garbage dump boxes also, there is also lot of garbage strewn around. This could lead to breeding of mosquitoes and cause of many diseases. With many commercial establishments around civic body is duty bound to clear stagnated water and garbage. The area normally used for parking two wheelers and abandon cars, says a commuter.

Water stagnation in the area was caused by encroachments on drains and waterbodies. Civic officials should remove all encroachments from the drains. They should complete the stormwater drain [project] by removal of encroachments. The drains were not completed because of the encroachments, says Mahalakshmi an office goer.

#### Submit SIR forms ahead of Dec 4 deadline

The Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) has asked voters to submit their filled-in enumeration forms for the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls well before the December 4 deadline, citing the need to complete data entry on time.

Booth-level officers (BLOs) began distributing the house-to-house verification forms across the 16 Assembly constituencies in the district on November 4.

Since they must collect the filled forms from voters and upload them on the Election Commission's app by December 4, voters have been advised not to wait until the last day. Residents have been asked to hand over the completed form to the visiting BLA and obtain acknowledgement on the duplicate copy.

Addressing the press, TN Chief Election Officer Archana Patnaik said, "Over 96% of the enumeration forms have been collected so far. Of these, about 33% have been digitised, while another 50% are currently being processed."

Voter help-centres set up at all polling stations will function till November 25 to assist residents to fill the form with guidance from BLOs, who will also visit households directly to collect the completed forms. Officials clarified that Aadhaar or any other document is not mandatory while filling the form.

As per Election Commission guidelines, recognised political parties may also submit the filled-in forms through their appointed booth agents, after obtaining the required signature on the duplicate.

Following this, the company was fined Rs. 2,000. The Tamil Nadu Food Safety Department has sent a notice to the online company to explain this within 15 days.

#### Student attacked by three men



centre building at Venkatapuram, with 58 lakh under the Capital Fund. This building will also consist of a ground floor and a first floor. The ground floor will be for a tailoring training centre and the first floor will accommodate a gymnasium for women.



# Water leaks in new pipes at Ramapuram

A newly installed pipe in Ramapuram has broken, causing water to leak out. The residents of the area are unhappy with the repeated breakages and water leaks in the same place.

In Ramapuram, Ward 155, Valasaravakkam Mandal, underground water pipes frequently broke, causing sewage to mix with them.

Since the pipes are old, work is underway to replace them with new ones. In this situation, continuous testing is being conducted to ensure that the newly installed pipes are supplying water smoothly.

During the testing days, drinking water is leaking through cracks in the new pipes. In this situation, during a test run on Valluvar Road Wednesday, water leaked through broken pipes at more than 10 places and overflowed onto the road. Water has already leaked at the same place.

Local residents have raised questions about whether this is happening continuously because the water pipe work has not been done properly.

The agency has sought an immediate verification and cancellation of the card, calling it a national-security lapse.



## Centre raises fitness certificate fees for 20-year-old vehicles

The Central Government has announced a steep hike in the Fitness Certificate fees for vehicles that are 20 years old, as part of its efforts to reduce the number of ageing vehicles on Indian roads.

According to the revised rates:

- Lorries and Buses: Fee increased from 03,500 to 025,000
- Medium Commercial Vehicles: 020,000
- Light Motor Vehicles: 015,000

Officials said the move aims to discourage the continued use of old, polluting vehicles and promote safer, environmentally compliant transport.



## Deadline extended for pet dog rabies vaccination

The Greater Chennai Corporation has extended the deadline for rabies vaccination, microchipping, and licensing of pet dogs until December 7.

As part of its dog population control program, the Corporation is administering sterilisation, rabies vaccination, and microchip tracking for both street dogs and pet dogs through GCC veterinary hospitals, shelters, Tamil Nadu veterinary hospitals, and private veterinarians.

So far, 65,422 pet dogs have been registered online and 24,477 licences have been issued. The earlier deadline

of November 24 has now been extended considering requests from pet owners.

Pet owners can visit veterinary centres in Tiru Vi Ka Nagar, Pulianthope, Lloyds Colony, Nungambakkam, Kannammapet, Meenambakkam, or the Sholinganallur Animal Birth Control Centre to get their dogs vaccinated, microchipped, and licensed.

## Applications invited for home guards service

Greater Chennai police have invited applications from both men and women to join their Home Guards Service. "Applications from young, energetic, dynamic individuals who are dedicated to public service for appointment as Home Guards are invited", a press release from the department said. As per the announcement, the applicants must possess good conduct with no criminal records, must be resident of Chennai city and they must be above 18 years and below 50 years of age as on October 1 with educational qualification of tenth standard pass or fail.

The selected Home Guards would be trained for one hour every day for 45 days. After completion of the training, they will be posted to a police station to assist the police in their respective areas. For every callout such as night duty, day patrol and traffic regulation, they will be paid 560 as special allowance.

Eligible candidates are asked to submit their curriculum vitae either in person or by e-mail to homeguarddcgcp@gmail.com on or before December 15.

#### MTC launches digital monthly passes

Tamil Nadu Minister for Transport and Electricity S.S. Sivasankar on Thursday launched the digital version of the Metropolitan Transport Corporation (MTC) monthly travel passes, making commute access faster and more convenient for Chennai residents.

With this upgrade, passengers can now purchase the Golden Ticket (\$\mathbb{D}\$1,000) and Diamond Ticket (\$\mathbb{D}\$2,000) directly through the Chennai One mobile app. The initiative, jointly introduced by MTC and the Chennai Unified Metropolitan Transport Authority (CUMTA), allows commuters to obtain unlimited-travel passes anytime, anywhere, without visiting ticket counters.

The Minister stated that the digital pass comes with a 30-day validity from the date of activation and can be purchased through 100% cashless payment options, including UPI, debit cards, and credit cards. The move is aimed at enhancing commuter convenience, reducing queues, and promoting digital public transport services in Chennai, press release said.





## Saidapet Govt **Hospital** to upgrade soon

a new 6-storey building has been constructed for A the Saidapet Government Hospital, the feasibility of converting it into a dedicated hospital for accident treatment is being studied.

Saidapet Government Hospital was established in 1920. Until three years ago, this hospital operated in an area of 7,500 square feet.

Those who go for emergency treatment from South Chennai will be provided with first aid here and then sent to Royapettah or Rajiv Gandhi Government

In this situation, a new 6-storey building with an area of 68,923 square feet was constructed in the same premises at a cost of Rs. 28.75 crore and came into use in September. The hospital administration said: The new building has 110 beds, including dengue, malaria, TB, blood testing, fracture, uterine, and general surgery departments, press release said.
