## **Voice of GOD**



### Soundareswarar Temple, Thirupanaiyur

This is the 190th Thevara Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 73rd Sthalam on the south side of the river Kaveri of Chozha Nadu. This place was called Thalavanam (Palm tree forest), and the temple is called Thalavaneswaram.

In Periyapuranam, Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva Thiyagaraja of Thiruvarur. Sundarar came to this temple after worshiping Lord Shiva and got Gold in the form of bricks to celebrate Panguni Uthiram at Thiruvarur with Paravai Nachiyar. Thirugnanasambandar, Sundarar, Manickavasagar, and Vallalar have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple.

Moolavar : Sri Soundareswarar, Sri Azhahiyanathar, Sri Thalavaneswarar. Consort : Sri Brukanthanayagi, Sri Periya Nayagi.

Some of the important features of this temple are as follows.

The temple faces east with an entrance arch/
Rajagopuram base with stucco images of
Rishabarooder at the center. A balipeedam and
Rishabam are immediately after the entrance arch. In
Koshtam Agasthiyar, Parasara maharishi,
Dakshinamurthy, Maha Vishnu, Brahma, and Durgai.
In praharam, Thunai Iruntha Vinayagar (for Karikal
Chozhan), Martruraitha Vinayagar (similar to
Thiruvarur), Subramaniar, Chandikeswarar,
Mahalakshmi (Stucco images), Shiva Lingas worshiped
by Sapta Rishis, Somaskandar (a different one with
fruit in left hand), and Chandikeswarar. A small
sannathi of Thalavaneswarar Temple (Sri
Panagatteeswarar Temple ) is also in the prakaram.
ARCHITECTURE

The main temple consists of the Sanctum sanctorum, antarala, artha mandapam, and a Mukha mandapam. The adhistanam is of prati banda adhistanam with Vrutha kumudam. The Prastaram is with valapi, kapotam, and Viyyalavari. An eka thala dravida Vimanam is over the sanctum.

#### HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th Century. The same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period (11th Century) and extended during the Pandyas and Vijayanagara periods. It is believed that Karikarchozha was brought up in this place.

There are about 14 inscriptions recorded from this temple. These inscriptions belong to Kulothunga Chozha-I, Rajathi Rajan-II, Sundara Pandyan, Parakrama Pandyan, Rajara Rajan-I, and Rajarajan-II. As per the inscriptions, the place was called Rajendra Chozha Panaiyur, and Lord Shiva was called Panayadiappan, Panangattiraivan, etc.

Vikrama Pandyan's 5th reign year inscription records the endowments of land and house lands gifted to the Adhi Chandeswarar temple.

Sundara Pandya period inscription records that there was a sandhi / kattalai in the name of the king, for naivedyam, 5 veli land was gifted to this temple. This is a copy of the old inscription, and the inscription's last word finishes with Thulyam (copy).

Rajathirajan-II's 10th reign year inscription records the gift of land as irayili to the Azhagu Devar by Chozha Panaiyur NattuKon and Kotramangalamudayan Adalvallan.

## SWD works on Amman Kovil Street, road blocked



The stormwater drain (SWD) work on Amman Kovil Street, one of the main roads in West Mambalam. Thousands of people use this road daily it has become a nightmare because of SWD. The work was started recently, the road was dug up to more than five depth and three metre width.

The SWD line is being laid by Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) after demolishing the existing pipe line throughout the road, resident says that this work had not only affected traffic but also traders. The entry points of the road via Govindan Road to Amman Koil Street have been dug and residents have to go around Jothi Ramalingam Street and are unable to enter the streets. The road is dug up like a trench, but no proper barricades have been fixed. Some ropes have been fastened on the side of the pit. This poses a huge risk to pedestrians and motorists, especially two wheeler riders, said the resident.

So, hundreds of people, especially office-goers, depend heavily on this road as it connects
Aranganathan Subway and the city.

## **Robotic Rehab is well received**



The state-of-the-art robotic and virtual reality technology used by patients with paralysis due to stroke and head injury at the K.K. Nagar Government Institute of

Rehabilitation Medicine in Chennai, has been well received says Dr. P. Thirunavukkarasu, director of the institute, due to this robotic patients are recovering much faster. He continued that no government hospital in Tamil Nadu has such hitech medical infrastructure robotic techniques are used here.

When a stroke or head injury occurs, brain cells are damaged. This disrupts communication between the brain and the rest of the body's nerves, preventing movement of arms and legs. Even if the bleeding, injury, or

blockage in the head is repaired, the body's movement, lost from the brain's memory cells, does not return immediately. Rehabilitation is the gradual restoration of that.

When such treatment is given, the brain begins to renew the connection between nerve cells. This is called neuroplasticity. Such treatments were until now provided with the help of conventional medical devices. Now, they are carried out with the help of hi-tech, imported equipment.

EMS (electrical muscle stimulation) training, which stimulates the muscles that are not working in the body, is provided first. After that, electrical vibrations are given to improve the movement of the muscles. For this, a device called electrical myograph stimulation (EMG) has been installed.

A robotic glove is used to train the hand, wrist and fingers. Hand and shoulder recovery training is provided through a robotic device imported from Thailand. There is also a special treadmill device to improve the ability of the legs. A virtual device is attached to the patients' eyes. Then, various games are displayed to his eyes. He has to catch some objects that appear in it using his hands or feet. Hundreds of patients have been benefitted from this robotic rehabilitation.

## Multilevel commercial complex planned

In a renewed attempt to ease parking congestion GCC has invited bids to hire a consultant for preparing a Detailed Feasibility Report (DFR) for a proposed multi-level parking-cum-commercial complex. GCC floating proposal for 1,667 sqm plot near Kodambakkam Bridge offering space for 400 plus space for two wheelers and 75 cars.

The initiative comes despite the limited success of the existing multi-level car park (MLCP) on Thanikachalam Road in the same area. Built at a cost of Rs 40.7 crore with capacity for 732 vehicles, including 513 two-wheelers and 222 cars, the utilisation levels have remained suboptimal since its commissioning

A consultant will determine feasibility based on the land characteristics and demand in T Nagar. The proposal covers both commercial development and a structured parking facility. Once the DFR is completed, tenders for construction will be floated in two months," The project is at an early stage.

Hawkers on Arya Gowda Road, West Mambalam are smart at responding quick to the needs of people on the eve of a festival or celebration. Even those who sell bommais at Navaratri time or kolam powder during margazhi. This week, one hawker based near Ayodhya Mandapam has been an early bird – the woman has displayed heaps of a variety of agal vilakkus. A dozen of the small sized lamps cost Rs.30 while a single, big size lamp is now quoted at Rs.200. Most of the lamps appear to be machine-cast products and not hand-moulded ones. And more over vilakku starts from Rs.5.

## Digital life certificate service at your doorstep via postman

The Department of Posts is facilitating the submission of the mandatory Annual Life Certificate (ALC) in digital mode for pensioners through India Post Payments Bank (IPPB), allowing them to complete the process without leaving their homes.

This initiative, available to Central/State Government, Army, and Employee Provident Fund (EPF) pensioners, enables the generation of the Digital Life Certificate (Jeevan Praman) using biometric authentication or the Face RD App. Pensioners can avail this doorstep service through their area postman or postal delivery staff for a normal service charge of Rs.70.

To generate the ALC, pensioners need to provide their Aadhaar number, mobile number, PPO number, and pension account details. Eligible pensioners are requested to avail this service through their postmen or by registering a service request online at http://ccc.cept.gov.in/ ServiceRequest//request.aspx or through the 'Postinfo' app.

# Submit SIR forms ahead of Dec 4 deadline

The Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) has asked voters to submit their filled-in enumeration forms for the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls well before the December 4 deadline, citing the need to complete data entry on time.

Booth-level officers (BLOs) began distributing the house-to-house verification forms across the 16 Assembly constituencies in the district on November 4. Since they must collect the filled forms from voters and upload them on the Election Commission's app by December 4, voters have been advised not to wait until the last day.

Residents have been asked to hand over the completed form to the visiting BLA and obtain acknowledgement on the duplicate copy.

Addressing the press, TN Chief Election Officer Archana Patnaik said, "Over 96% of the enumeration forms have been collected so far. Of these, about 33% have been digitised, while another 50% are currently being processed."

Voter help-centres set up at all polling stations will function till November 25 to assist residents to fill the form with guidance from BLOs, who will also visit households directly to collect the completed forms. Officials clarified that Aadhaar or any other document is not mandatory while filling the form.

As per Election Commission guidelines, recognised political parties may also submit the filled-in forms through their appointed booth agents, after obtaining the required signature on the duplicate.

In such a situation, it is surprising that the first steps of mobile phones in India were taken only three decades ago.

First call?

The official journey of mobile phones in India began on July 31, 1995.

The then Chief Minister of West Bengal, the late Jyoti Basu, created history by making India's first mobile phone call.

The late West Bengal Chief Minister Jyoti Basu spoke to the then Union Minister of Communications Sukh Ram on the phone using a Nokia mobile phone.

It is noteworthy that this call w as connected through Modi Telstra network.

The mobile revolution in India

When mobile phones became popular among the public, call charges were very high.

During that period, the cost of a minute of call was Rs. 8.4, and during peak hours, the cost of using the network for a call doubled to Rs. 16.8. This is about Rs. 170 in today's rupees.

But the landscape began to change after Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Jio entered the telecom business in India in 2016.

Jio has revolutionized the telecommunications industry, making mobile calls to any network in India virtually free

Although standard reasonable rates apply for international calls, the arrival of Jio, India has become one of the few countries with the lowest mobile tariff plans and internet service charges in the

She was admitted and given first aid in the K K Nagar Government Hosipital from there, she was sent to the Royapettah Government Hospital for further treatment. Where she scummed to injuries. The KK Nagar police have registered a case and are investigating.
