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Voice of GOD



Ponvaithanathar Temple, Sithamoor

This is the 223rd Thevaram Paadal Petra Shiva Sthalam and the 106th Sthalam on the south side of the river Kaveri in Chozha Nadu. The place was called Chitremam during the Thevaram period and is now called "Sithamoor" and is locally called Chithaimur.

In Periyapuram, Sekkizhar records that Thirugnanasambandar came to this temple after worshipping Lord Shiva of Thirukalar. In that, he didn't mention this temple in particular, but mentioned other temples on the way to Thirumaraikadu. Thirugnanasambandar and Vallalar have sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple.

Moolavar : Sri Swarna Sthabaneswarar, Sri Ponvaithanathar, Consort : Sri Akilandeswari. Some of the salient features of this temple are..... The temple faces east with a 3-tier Rajagopuram. Balipeedam and Rishabam are after the Rajagopuram. In Koshtam Vinayagar, Dakshinamurthy, Lingothbavar, Brahma, and Durgai.

Urchavars are Velavar, Somaskandar, Aadipoora Amman, Pradosha Nayagar, Chandrasekar, Sambandar, and a Chettiar with his wife.

In praharam Kanni Vinayagar, Murugan, Mahalakshmi, Brahmarishi, Ayyanar, Bhairavar, Saneeswarar, Suriyan, and Viswanathar. The Temple complex consists of the sanctum sanctorum, antarala, artha mandapam, and a maha mandapam. A two-tier Vimana is in the sanctum.

HISTORY AND INSCRIPTIONS

Since Thirugnanasambandar has sung hymns in praise of Lord Shiva of this temple, the original temple might have existed before the 7th century. Later, the same was reconstructed as a stone temple during the Chozha period and further expanded by the Nayakas.

The Inscriptions recorded from this temple belong to Chozha Kings, Madurai Konda Koparakesarivarmar, Rajakesari Varmar, Rajendra Chozha, Thiribhuvana Chakravarthi Rajendra Chozha, Pandya Kings Varaguna Pandya, Srivallabha alias Veera Panya, Maravarman Sundara Pandyan, and Vijayanagara Kings Venkatapathy Rayar.

As per the inscriptions, this place was in "Rajarajavalanattu VettraRRu Nattu Puntrirkootrathu Thiruchitremam". This place was called Thiruchitremam in 1459 CE. Lord Shiva was called Thiruchitremamudayar, Pazhayavanaththambiranar, Pazhayavana Perumal, Pazhayavana Thambiranar, and Thiru(va)aathitha Eswaramudayar. Kulothunga Chozha-III's 35th reign year inscription records the endowment of some gifts by the Muppathu Vattathu Brahmins. Inscription's last portion was not available.

Rajendra Chozha-III's 6th reign year inscription records the endowment of burning a sandhi lamp, for the same gold coins were received by the people working with the temple. There is a word "Pittukku man sumantha", which denotes the "Thiruvilayadal Purana". More details couldn't be obtained since the inscription was badly damaged.

Two nos of 12th-century fragment inscriptions record some endowments and the donations were made, in terms of Land, etc.

A damaged 17th-century Thanjavur Nayaka's inscription records the endowment of burning a sandhi lamp for which 150 kasu was handed over to Siva Brahmins, and they agreed to do the same.

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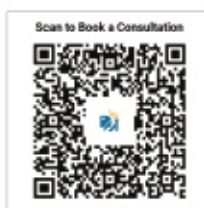


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AROUND CHENNAI CITY

Two young men attacked by gang in T Nagar

Lalit Kishore and Sanjay both are childhood friends from C.I.T. Nagar. When both friends were having a tea opposite to Saidapet Government Hospital and then walked along the 10-foot road in T. Nagar. While walking along four persons interpreted them and took them to a isolated spot behind Housing Board resident in Kamaraj Colony T Nagar.

There, Ramesh Kumar and his friends allegedly threatened Lalit Kishore asking him why you have not visited me when I came out of prison spoke appropriately and thrashed him severely.

Based on the complaint, the Mambalam police arrested four people on Thursday. The arrested were Ramesh Kumar, 28, Vignesh, 26, Ruben Chakravarthy, 20, and Ramachandran, 36, all the four sent to jail.

Cash bag lost and found

A unclaimed cash bag was found at NSK Nagar signal junction at Arumbakkam. The cash bag was containing Rs 34,000. According to police Special Sub-Inspector (SSI) Karuppasamy was on duty at NSK Nagar signal junction on Sunday night. He found out a bag of a jewellery collection agent which contains the cash and was waiting for the rightful owner for nearly an hour but nobody claimed it.

The bag was containing cash, a purse, ATM card and small chit books. He secured the bag and handed it over to the Arumbakkam Police Station.

Probe revealed that the bag belonged to Mohan (26), a collection agent working in the marketing section of a jewellery shop in Anna Nagar. Mohan had collected chit funds from customers on Sunday and was riding his two wheeler on his way back to the office when the bag fell on the floor. Police higher officers appreciated SSI Karuppasamy for his prompt action.

Police arrest rowdy who tried to attack driver with knife

Police arrested a rowdy who had an argument with a car driver and tried to attack him with a knife.

Santosh, 26, of 60th Street, Ashok Nagar car driver. On the 21st, he was talking to friends near Amma Unavagam on 61st Street, Ashok Nagar. At that time, two men with a belt knife got into an argument with the public. Then they got into an argument with Santosh, tried to attack him with their hands and fled from there.

Based on the complaint, Kumaran Nagar police investigated and arrested Karthik, 27, of Nallanguppam, who was involved in the incident. It was found that he had 11 criminal cases against him, including theft, ganja, and robbery. The police are searching for another person who escaped.

Woman dies by suicide after threat of obscene videos

27-year-old woman who resides in Mathiazhagan Nagar, Saligramam was found dead on Monday. According to police she died by suicide as she was threatened by unidentified caller threatening her with obscene photos and videos to share on the internet and to his husband. She was stressed and in fear died of suicide. The deceased woman lived with her husband in a rented house in Saligramam. Probe revealed that the woman received two phone calls in different numbers.

The woman informed her husband about the calls and blocked the numbers. On Tuesday (August 25), the husband left for work on Tuesday morning and he called her in the afternoon to check on her. Since, he did not return his repeated calls, he alerted his neighbours who went to the house and found it locked from inside.

Neighbours broke the door open and entered the house and found the woman unconscious. Virugambakkam police reached the scene on information and moved the woman to a hospital where she was declared as 'brought dead'. Police are investigating the case.

Two attacked 50 year old man dispute over rent arrears

Sulaiman, 50, has been living in a rented house on the Periyar Road, in Choolaimedu. He is married and has four children. Sulaiman, who owns six autos, rents out

five of them and drives one himself.

In this case, Jameel, 35, from his hometown, lives in Thiruvallikeni. Sulaiman rented him an auto two months ago. He has not paid 11 days of rent.

Sulaiman had contacted Jameel on his mobile phone and asked him to pay the rent arrears. At that time, an argument broke out between the two. In this situation, Jameel and his friend Ajmeer, 35, from Nungambakkam, went to Sulaiman's house on the Periyar Road in Choolaimedu. There, the two who got into an argument with Sulaiman, repeatedly hit him in the face with their hands. In this, three of his teeth were broken and two more are loose. He also suffered internal injuries. The two men were arrested for attacking Sulaiman.

The injured Sulaiman was rescued by the locals and admitted to the Kilpauk Government Hospital. The Vadapalani police, who investigated, arrested Jamil and Ajmeer.

Rlys to upgrade drinking water facilities at 20,000 locations

The Indian Railways has launched a major initiative to improve drinking water quality at around 20,000 locations across the country following concerns over bacterial contamination at railway stations.

The move follows a CAG report that reportedly detected E. coli bacteria in samples of free drinking water supplied through water coolers at several stations. Under the first phase, the Railways will introduce 'Tank to Tap' water purification and monitoring systems, including at water-cooler facilities.

Old or poorly maintained water storage tanks will be replaced, while regular cleaning and water-quality testing will be strengthened at both sources and distribution points. Railway authorities have also been asked to publish water-quality reports to improve transparency and accountability. The programme will be expanded to additional locations based on requirements.

Renovated Amma Park waiting for public use



Although renovation work at the park was completed around two months ago, the facility continues to remain closed. Residents urge GCC to open the facility as soon as possible. This is one of the important park for the children to play. This area has more than 500 houses and depend upon the single park in the neighbourhood.

The Amma Park Users Association said the park was previously a popular gathering point, attracting more than 800 visitors every day. Schoolchildren, senior citizens and residents regularly used the facility for walking, jogging, exercise and recreation.

According to a long time resident Saidai Babu residing at Bharathiyar Street, Abjith Colony said that, a representation was submitted to the Saidapet MLA about a month ago seeking the park's reopening, but no progress has been made. Residents are now being forced to travel to parks in Ashok Nagar and K K Nagar for their daily walks and recreational activities.

The CMDA began the renovation of Amma Park in August 2025 at a cost of ₹2.91 crore. The upgraded facility includes modern play equipment, a renovated skating court and badminton court, seating areas, walking and jogging tracks, a refurbished fountain, restrooms, a small science park and outdoor fitness equipment.

Residents from areas including Theeder Nagar, Samiyar Thottam, West Saidapet, Panneerselvam Nagar and Sekar Nagar are among those dependent on the park. Residents have also highlighted the importance of reopening the park for children and young people, particularly for sports and outdoor activities. The association, along with Makkal Needhi Maiyam functionaries, plans to hold a protest in the coming days if not opened.

Will the encroachment removed?



The Adyar River, which begins at Athanur, passes through Mannivakkam, Varadarajapuram, Anakaputhur, and Gaulbazar and meets the sea near Pattinapakkam. In many places, numerous residential areas have been built encroaching on the river banks.

The encroachment of houses on the banks of the Adyar river in Saidapet be removed?

The Adyar River flows through MGR Nagar, 137th and 138th wards, Jafferkanpet, 139th ward and Saidapet, 142nd ward, which are part of the Kodambakkam zone. In this, the areas up to Kanunagar, Choolaipallam, Jafferkanpet and Kashi Theatre Bridge are low-lying areas.

Due to this, during the rainy season, these areas are prone to rainwater, severely affecting the public. In the past survey alone in M.G.R. Nagar 137 - 138 wards 455 houses have been surveyed and removed and resettled in another area.

The residents were resettled in the Urban Habitat Development Board housing schemes and their old houses were also demolished. Similarly, in Ward 139, Jafferkanpet, 320 houses were found to be squatters.

However, in Ward 142, Saidapet, along the banks of the Adyar River, 519 houses were identified.

The Urban Habitat Development Board was recommended to allocate houses for resettlement of the residents here.

After the demolition of the Urban Habitat Development Board housing in the Gothamedu area of Saidapet and the

construction of new housing, the work of removing encroachments was hampered due to a demand to resettle all 519 families there.

With the change of government, there has been a demand among social activists that steps be taken to remove encroachments along the riverbanks and that work to prevent the effects of monsoon floods be continued without delay.

The Chennai Metropolitan Transport Corporation has selected and studied proposed routes to operate 20 new double-decker buses in Chennai.

Twenty years ago, double-decker buses were introduced in Chennai. This allowed more people to travel at the same time and also allowed them to enjoy the beauty of the city's tall buildings.

Over time, due to the increase in flyovers and traffic congestion, the service of these buses was discontinued in 2008. In this situation, the Municipal Transport Corporation is undertaking work to operate new double-decker buses in Chennai.

Regarding this, Chennai Municipal Transport Corporation officials said:

We are working on resuming double-decker bus services in Chennai. In which, two companies, OHM Global, a subsidiary of Ashok Leyland, and Eagle Construction Co., participated in the tender.

The contractor will be selected and 20 double-decker buses will be put into service in the next three months. The work of selecting the routes for operating these buses is underway.

We are conducting a study on the proposed two routes: Beach - Kovalam, Koyambedu - Anna Sathukkam, Toll Plaza - Lighthouse, Broadway - TMS, or Guindy and Poonamalli Highway. The final study will be confirmed and announced later, press release said.

September 1 garbage must be segregated: GCC

Those who generate excessive waste will have to segregate their waste into recyclable and non-recyclable waste from September 1. Violation will attract fines, said Municipal Commissioner G.S. Sameeran. A study meeting with officials on the solid waste management work being undertaken in the Chennai Metropolitan City was held at the Ribbon Building yesterday under the chairmanship of Municipal Commissioner G.S. Sameeran. Speaking at the event, Commissioner Sameeran said: "In areas where solid waste is generated, including apartment complexes and hotels, steps should be taken to segregate waste into separate categories: household waste, non-household waste, sanitary waste, and hazardous waste. Awareness campaigns are being conducted among the public regarding this." From September 1, violators will be fined and action will be taken. Similarly, awareness campaigns will be continued to ensure that all places, including residential areas, segregate their waste. House-to-house awareness campaigns have been launched.



Eateries occupy large portion of pavements

Footpaths around Valluvar Kottam are turning into a maze of encroachments, as eateries, vegetable vendors and parked water tanker lorries squeeze pedestrians onto Valluvar Kottam High Road.

Eateries have spilled onto the pavement, giving it the look of an unauthorised food street. Tea, coffee, juice and briyani stalls have set up large cooking vessels, gas cylinders, chairs and name boards on the footpath, while parked two-wheelers further shrink the space left for

pedestrians. 'Footpath encroachments should be viewed in the same light as any other obstruction on a road', said a local resident Gopal of Vidwan Sundaram Street, he continued.

Vegetable vendors have occupied the footpath with their plastic crates and heaps of produce, leaving no space for pedestrians. Vendors routinely return despite enforcement efforts. 'Water tanker lorries make it worse', he added.

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
